Jon won the Junior F/S, 55.86; Lucy was 2nd in the Intermediate FLY, 1.05.12; Nicola excelled herself to take 2nd in the BR, 1.13.95; and Gemma was 3rd in the Open FLY, 1.05.97.

Inter-Counties - Sheffield (25m.)

Lucy Lloyd-Roach placed 3rd in the <u>FLY</u> with a p.b. of 1.04.91; Nicola swam 1.00.39 in the <u>F/S</u>, so close to that sub 60 secs. which must come soon; and **Jon Sheasby** swam in the relays.

The gala was something of a non-event, with very weak opposition, and a somewhat inefficient starting pistol. Despite that, most of our team took the opportunity to swim close to their best times. 23.10.99 A.S.A. Masters - Sheffield (25m.)

Alex Knibbs appeared briefly but stayed long enough to win the 1500m. and to set a new European Record for the event – well done. Hayden Wakeling is now a committed Masters competitor, and he won the 100 F/S, 54.03, the 200 F/S, the 400 F/S and the 100 FLY, 58.91 also taking silver and bronze in the BK. Not to be outdone, Trevor Clark set a new record

time for the <u>I.M.</u> and had 2 other golds and 2 silvers. He also set some good times on 50's and 25's at a Masters County Match at Grantham a few weeks later. **Kate Chase** and **Hayley Bettinson** joined the 2 men for the Mixed Relays, finishing 5th in the Medley and 7th in the <u>F/S</u>.
