### Congratulations to the Camp Hill Youth Team (under 16's).

They won the Midland Youth League with a 100% unbeaten record.

This is just reward for a lot of hard work and effort over the last three years from the team and coach Richard Sheasby. The squad was first formed in 1998 when some of the original members were only 12 years of age (comprising of both boys and girls) and has steadily developed over the last two years under Richard's guidance. Their growing success has also continued to attract additional members to the squad resulting in this seasons very strong team, with five members attending the Midland Youth Team Trials, (Oliver Goodwin, John Sheasby, Edward Freeman James Sumner and Ewan Martin).

The main highlight of this year's campaign was the general standard of polo played by the team. The accuracy of passing was good, the movement around the pool creating passing and goalscoring opportunities was excellent and most impressively they attacked and defended as a team unit. The only area that will need addressing next season is that the defending was sometimes too vigorous, resulting in us topping the Major Fouls League table. This is the first time since the 1970's that Camp Hill has fielded any polo team that has gone through a season unbeaten.

This will be a very hard act to follow – we will need new recruits to maintain this impetus – so go on boys and girls have a go! All those interested should contact Richard or Polly Sheasby at the Club.

Not much to report on this one. **Jon Sheasby** won the 15/16 <u>F/S</u>, 57.37, against strong opposition, and **Gemma Hindson** took bronze in the <u>FLY</u>, 1.07.60. **Michael Bourne** came close to his short course time in the FLY, 1.19.62.

18/20th Feb. 2000 Leeds Grand Prix (50m.)

Georgina Lee had a successful weekend, placing 1st in the 200 FLY, 2nd in the 100m. and 3rd in the 50 and in the 800. Lucy Lloyd-Roach was 2nd in the 100 FLY B Final, 1.06.88. Nicola Sheasby tackling what was for her an unusually heavy programme reached 2 A finals and 2 B finals. Jon Sheasby swam 2.04.39 for the 200 F/S and Laura Heeley and Gemma Ramsden also swam good times.

## County Championships - March - Coventry (50m.)

Week one: Georgina Lee was our star with victories in the 50 FLY, 100, 200 & 400 F/S. Her split times show the value of regular hard training: 200 - 63.48/64.41, 400 - 2.10.86/2.13.82. Nicola Sheasby came of age with Silver in the F/S - that long awaited sub-60s - 59.98. This was the first time that we have had two girls under the minute in the same race, with the additional bonus of long course. Nicola then went on to win the 100 BR, with another p.b., 1.15.24 and was 3rd in the 200 F/S. Lucy Lloyd-Roach won the 17/18 BK and Jodie Leresche swam a determined FLY to take Silver.

Many of our younger swimmers entered, and most coped with the long pool very well. Sam Baker swam a brilliant <u>BR</u> heat 1.31.55, despite looking around several times to find the whereabouts of the rest of his heat. In the final, he tried too hard, stroking too fast, but will benefit from the experience.

There were many good swims: Ruth Fraser and Hollie Joyce on F/S; Justine Clark BR and BK; Kirsty Rostill F/S and BR; Richard Baker, Daniel Greaves and Lewis Hands on FLY; Hope Weaver FLY and F/S; Sarah Thornton BR; Jon Sheasby BK and FLY, 1.03.90; Ian Potter FLY, 1.02.52; Andrew Weedall 1.12.11. Both our teams qualified for the 13/14 Medley Relay final, which was good as 7 of the 8 girls are eligible next year, and the A team Sarah Wyse, Ruth Fraser, Nicola and Gemma Hindson won the 17/18 Girls F/S Relay and we were 3rd in the Junior and the 15/16 Boys Relays.

## Weeks 2 and 3, 11th/18th March

The appended results show that Georgina, Nicola and Lucy had further successes. Kate Hindson placed 2nd in the 15/16 BR, as did Ian Potter in the 200 FLY; Hope Weaver and Trevor Clark were 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 10 yr. and Open BK – a good age range! Jon Sheasby improved his F/S to 57.13, and the following week to 56.84. There were good F/S swims from Richard Baker and Andrew Vale, and further successes in the relays.

#### Summary

10 swimmers shared 30 individual medals, and 11 teams won medals, both totals being down on the previous year. Cost of team entries: £216.00.
