Success at Guernsey

Kate Chase and Hayley Bettinson did very well in the Guernsey Masters Meet. Hayley collected 5 Golds, including F/S 28.77 & 1.04.55, FLY 32.09, and Kate won 1 Gold & 4 Silvers.

Midland Records

Midland Records were taken by Georgina Lee in a 10 day period of travel and competition. She was close to her best in the first 3 Meets at Monaco, and, progressing to Barcelona, reduced her 200 FLY by 2 secs. to 2.12.6. Then on to Sheffield for the Grand Prix where she again swam 2.12.6 to take Gold, and reduced her 100 time to 1.01.40 placing 3rd of the G.B. competitors – both times setting new Midland records.

Claire Duffy is already one of the leading police swimmers, and she underlined this by several Golds in the Police Championships at Edinburgh, including a 200 F/S record, 2.25.02.

28th/30th April 2000 - A BUSY WEEKEND

Midland Masters, Leamington

Our annual visit to Leamington took place in sunshine as usual – the finest weekend of the year spent in the pool again. With a very hot and humid atmosphere, the Camp Hill team spent most of its time in the cooler locker area.

Newcomers Paul Millington and Val Orchard were swimming in their first individual competitions, whereas old-timer Nick Green QC was competing for the first time in over 20 years – good to see him back in the Camp Hill team. Paul and Val put in good performances on the 50s fly and freestyle, and breaststroke and freestyle respectively, while Nick entered 50 and 100 freestyle only and showed he had lost none of his sparkle, coming second in both.

For once our team was dominated by the females, both numerically and in terms of overall placings. Regular's Hayley Bettinson (in charge of the new masters'club uniform), Claire Duffy and Kate Chase were joined by Jo Mason on the comeback trail and persuaded Lynn Clark to enter some individuals as well as the relays. Together with Anne Bourne we had entered two women's relays in each event, whereas our men (Hayden Wakeling, Nick Green and Trevor Clark in the individuals plus support for the relays) only managed one.

The relays became quite fraught with one last minute withdrawal necessitating urgent phone calls – Suzanne Linton appeared with a costume and helped the 'young' mixed freestyle relay to a silver medal. Good performances from our 'regular' relay only swimmers (Paul Rogers, Kevin Woodward and Norman Stephens) all helped to the medal tally.

Final results:

Relays: 3 gold, 3 silver, 1 bronze.

Individuals: 24 gold, 6 silver, 9 bronze.

Club placings on points: Men third, women second, overall third (to FHM and Kenilworth).

Overall an enjoyable weekend as usual, with a few acquaintances renewed after many years.

Three general observations: we need more people to enter individuals to give us strength in depth for the relays; entries in events over 100 metres are still very much the exception (stamina work needed?); and the level of consistency over the weekend was very impressive, with most swimmers repeating 50s within half a second of each other each time (fitness levels seem good!). Let's hope we can increase the size of our squad next year and threaten Kenilworth for second placed club overall.

Then down an age group - Bath Grand Prix (50m.)

Our visit to this National Sports Centre, with its 50m. pool produced some good results after two 12 hour days (for the coach!). Georgina Lee placed 2nd in the 100m. and the 200m. FLY – the latter with a p.b. of 2.14.67. Nicola Sheasby was 2nd in the B final of the <u>BR</u>, but won the B final of the <u>F/S</u>, 1.00.68. Brother Jon, however, was the star of the show when he followed up a p.b. in the heat of the 15/16 yrs. <u>F/S</u>, 56.78 with, even better – an excellent 55.55 to win the final convincingly. He also swam 1.02.66, for 2nd place in the <u>FLY</u>. Michael Bourne and the Heeley twins had some good swims and Gemma Ramsden was 3nd in the 10/12 <u>BR</u>, 1.27.88.

<u>Down another age group – Junior Gala – Bromsgrove (27¹2 yds.)</u> Orion 206, C/Hill 185, Bromsgrove 168, Triple S 161, Kidlington 118, Boldmere 52

This was an exciting gala, with many close races. Best swims included Sam Baker, 50 BR 40.98; Justine Clark, FLY 34.62 and Charlotte Parker, BK 38.99. Danielle Bourne acquitted herself very well in her first match for the Club.

6th/7th May 2000 Midland Long Course Championships

Georgina Lee won 4 Golds: 400 F/S 4.20.87 (2.09.22 / 2.11.65), 800 F/S, 100 and 200 FLY. She had to work in the former, 1.02.86, to hold off the challenge of international freestyler Karen Pickering, who although she rarely races FLY is no mean performer on the stroke. Hayden Wakeling and Jon Sheasby were 11th, 12th respectively in the F/S. Ian Potter, Nicola Sheasby and Ewan Martin had some good swims, and Lucy Lloyd-Roach, despite a poor showing on the 200 FLY swam well in the 100, 1.06.87, and in the 200 BK, 2.26.47.

finish properly. Her sister, Jodie had a very successful evening, but now she too must cease finishing with her nose on the wall.

Other good swims: F/S Lillie Gregg 17.42; BK Alex Evans 20.61, Daniel Greaves 23.16 – despite slipping at the start. We had no disqualifications, and by finishing 4th kept alive our hopes of remaining in Division I.
