June 2000 - Great Britain Masters Championships - Crystal Palace (50m.)

Our sole contender, **Trevor Clark**, once more kept the Club's name to the fore with a string of successes in the 45/49 years age group. **Trevor** took Gold in <u>FLY</u>, <u>BK</u>, 31.94, and <u>F/S</u> 1.01.10, plus 4 Silvers – a good weekend's work. Interesting also to note ex-member Simon **Garside** collecting several medals in the 40/44 group.

10.6.2000 Inter-Club - Melton Mowbray (25m.)

Everyone enjoyed this match in the attractive pool on the edge of a park. As I feared, our team was too strong, winning 31 of 49 events, but our competitors enjoyed the 50m. events. There were many good times, including: Sam Baker, F/S 32.44; Nicola Sheasby, BR 34.70; sister Leanne, FLY 32.44 – I do hope that she will train regularly in the new season; Ian Potter, FLY 28.19 – what a reliable representative he has been over the past 7 years; Laura Heeley, BR 38.76 (I am still hopeful); Justine Clark, FLY 34.69; Ben Howell, F/S 26.14 – many good swims will be required from him during the next two years. The kneeling start displayed by Kerry Wyse is unlikely to become a technical improvement.

Father's Day - Inter-County Match

Despite team shortages due to other commitments, and the fact that it was Father's Day – plus the hottest day of the year so far, some of the older Warwickshire swimmers – Masters to the initiated (that's over 25 years old) competed at Womborne in the annual Inter-County event organised by Staffordshire. The team was drawn from members of FHM Masters (Birmingham), Kenilworth Masters, Rugby and Camp Hill Edwardians, twelve men and women good and true, would that it could have been twelve more.

All the teams suffered from the choice of date, which meant more races than normal for all, even the daunting task of starting against **Nick Gillingham**, when giving away 15 years. The fact that he had set a new British Breaststroke record for the 25+ age group, in a solo effort

just three races before, was no comfort whatsoever. First up on the blocks was the 100+ aggregate age group relay, where we came fourth. That set the tone for much of the gala, which ended with Warwickshire in fourth place overall. Yorkshire finished clear winners by over 40 points from Staffordshire, the home team. Derbyshire followed with 141 points with Warwickshire on 124 points. However, no one gave up.

Rachel Rowan (Rugby 25+ years) answered with a second in the Butterfly and later with first in the Backstroke. Not leaving it there, she also came second in her Freestyle and Individual Medley events – busy girl! Complementing her, Trevor Clark (Camp Hill Edwardians 45+ years) got second in his Backstroke and Butterfly races, plus first in the Individual Medley and Freestyle. Hayley Bettinson (Camp Hill 35+) easily won her Butterfly race, two whole seconds clear and emphasised the point by winning her Freestyle race. Arthur Lowe (Camp Hill 65+) won both his Backstroke and Freestyle races. It was a close thing on the Backstroke, less than a tenth of a second, or just a bit more than hand's length.

There is a second round on Sunday the 12th November in Grantham – a popular pool. Plans are already being made to send a bigger team, with prospective members being told to reserve the date. Watch this space- they intend to improve on this result!
