ENGLISH / COMMONWEALTH GAMES TRIALS

Congratulations to Georgina Lee on achieving selection for her second Commonwealth Games. Georgina made a good start to the week with 4th place in the 200 F/S thereby qualifying for the Relay Team. Her time of 2.01.79 was a County Record, as was her 28.28 in the 50 FLY. The following day she broke her British Record for the 100 FLY, 60.35, and further reduced it in the final 60.29, creeping ever closer to the "magic minute". The final day Georgina had a comfortable win in the 200 FLY, 2.10.59, only just outside her British Record in the Olympics semi-final.

WORLD MASTERS, NEW ZEALAND - April

One intrepid traveller in our midst decided to take on the world...

Simeon Hemming ventured to the southern hemisphere to pit his wits and considerable swimming talent against the best, with impressive success. Warming up with the Australian Masters Champs, where he took 2 Silver and a Bronze he then travelled to New Zealand to take 9th place in the 50m, 100m and 200m BR events at the World Masters. He is now the proud possessor of 3 "Pewter" World Masters medals – our huge congratulations go along with some worthy rewards for his hard work!

This was a good “experience” Meet, long course, long waits for races and a long time outside the building on a very cold evening thanks to the fire alarm. Our 8 competitors swam well, in particular: Laura Heeley, BR 1.16.80, 2nd. Hope Weaver 200 BK 2.46.49, 2nd, but still needing a stronger opening to her races to do herself justice. Jodie Le Resche drew on her basic speed to win the 50 F/S, 30.58 and take 4th place in the 50 FLY, 34.25, also a NQT in the 200 F/S.

GINGER NORTH RELAY CUP, LEAMINGTON - 12th January

We have won this relay trophy in the past, but there was no hope of doing so this year without a full team of 9 yr olds. In fact, it was heartening to come 3rd when in 8 out of 33 events we could not score. We had only two 9 yr old boys and three 9 yr old girls and four of each are required. Thus we had either to leave one lane empty in all the 9 yr races or swim (and declare) an overage swimmer. In most events we chose the latter, so that our new 9 yr olds Patrick Clark, Lloyd Glasspool, Rachel Learmonth, Rebekah Bullivant and Stephanie Bache were able to race. They all swam well and maintained their times through 4 or 5 races – but WE NEED MORE OF THEM!

Our older swimmers made valiant efforts, with several producing pb’s in their events. Notable swims: BK Lisa Coleman 19.61, but it is time that she learnt where the end of the pool is. Alex Lycett BK 20.89 and BR 23.19 (both a 2 secs improvement). Rachel Learmonth BR 25.45 and F/S 19.84; Matthew Woodyatt FLY 40.60, BR 45.40; Adam Streeter FLY 37.28; Harriet Bromley F/S a 4 secs pb.

BRIERLEY HILL MEET - 26/27th January

This was a long but successful weekend, with “girl power” gaining our best results. Hollie Joyce F/S 1.03.29; Justine Clark F/S 1.04.09, FLY 31.04 and 1.08.88; Jodie Le Resche F/S 30.00 and 2.33.85, FLY 33.63; Kelly Thornton F/S 30.99 and 1.08.74; sister Sarah F/S 34.54; Kirsty Rostill F/S 1.11.58; Sophie Heeley F/S 1.11.08; Louisa Ball 4.59.58; Laura Heeley BR 34.80 and a reluctant 2.54.87 – she must learn to judge her pace. Although less dominant, the boys did well on F/S Stuart Tierney and Andrew Vale swam good 200’s, and Andrew and Alastair McKenzie continue to creep close to that sub-60 sec, with 60.88 and 60.33 respectively. Alastair also won the 50 BR 34.41. Pb’s from the Baker boys, Stephen F/S 37.95 and Richard 2.36.87. Simon Crowe in his first swims for Camp Hill had a pb of 2.26.81 in the BK. Another pb from one of our officials at the buffet, who coped with 3 sweets!

INTER-CLUB TROPHY GALA, STECHFORD - 2nd February

This was an exciting, closely-fought gala with several good swims. Alastair McKenzie turned up to break a minute for the first time, succeeding despite an inefficient start – 59.41. Now he has to set a new target. Hollie Joyce confirmed the previous week’s improvement with a 63 secs, also setting a BK pb of 1.13.47. Good BR swims from Laura Heeley, Kirsty Rostill, James Fox 1.13.82, Matthew Woodyatt 1.35.55 and Gerard Morley, who needs to reduce his stroke rate. Kate Hindson was close to her best in FLY 1.10.88 as was Gemma Fox. Jodie Le Resche produced pb’s on FLY 33.36 and F/S 1.09.32. Richard Baker swam a sound F/S 1.14.36 and new member James Wigley an encouraging 57.60.

WYCOMBE MEET – 9/10/11TH February

Laura Heeley was our star, winning the Open 50 BR 35.12 (Prize £50.00) and the age-group 100 BR 1.17.20. Her weekend also included a County swim, 1.15.67. Jodie Le Resche lowered her FLY time to 1.22.62 and her F/S to 1.09.64. While Hope Weaver had a good BK win 1.17.65 and swam a 1.10.96 F/S. The Meet also provided good long course experience for Andrew Vale, Sophie Heeley, Jaimee Le Resche and Simon Crowe – but why does he always choose events at the end of the session?!

WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS - March

This event which used to be the highlight of the County swimming calendar, got underway for the second year in its new format. Despite numerous complaints and suggestions, the organiser had stuck to the new programme which lumps all swimmers in an event, and only has finals for the open events. To be fair it is difficult because the National Performance Director, Bill Sweetenham, charged with raising British swimming standards by 2004, had decided on different distances and age groups, and counties have to take some note of all this. However, many felt the organisers had gone too far. Thus patient spectators sat through 148 consecutive competitors in the ladies 50 FLY and 229 in the men's 50 F/S. In accordance with the philosophy, the age for event was 8th April (rather than 31st December), but only the year of birth was given in the programme. This meant that no-one was able to work out who was racing whom, which effectively reduced the races to a series of time trials.

Many coaches felt that the absence of finals for age groups was unhelpful and lost a valuable opportunity for younger swimmers to experience the different and extra pressures of finals.

In addition, there were still no medals for 9, 10 and 11 year olds. The scoreboard was erratic, the announcer was hard to hear and result sheets were not available till the following week.

Four Saturdays, instead of three, avoided the overly-long sessions of last year, but made the whole event something of an endurance test. More than one parent remarked that "it wasn't like the old days".

On the bright side we had some good swims; 50 FLY Danielle Bourne 47.06; Ellen Moore 47.17; Jodie Le Resche 33.44 (2nd); Sarah Thornton 37.19; Kelly Thornton 32.32 (3rd); 50 F/S Kieran Iyer 35.03; Matthew Woodyatt 34.22; Lewis Hands 34.08; Oliver Weaver 36.97; Alastair McKenzie 27.57 (1st); Andrew Vale 27.25 (2nd); 100 BR Hope Weaver 1.30.43 (3rd); Kirsty Rostill 1.31.27 (3rd); Laura Heeley 1.18.54 (2nd); 100 F/S Hope 1.08.29 (1st); Jodie 1.10.85 (2nd); Hollie Joyce 1.03.80. James Fox was 2nd, 1.15.80, in the 100 BR off virtually no training. Louisa Ball rounded-off the day with a good 800 F/S 10.17.39.

DAY 2

Some very encouraging BK from our younger swimmers: Richard Baker 40.83; Sam Middleton 43.53; James Earl 45.25; Hope Weaver 1.16.58 (1st); Jodie Le Resche 1.18.01 (2nd); Andrew Vale 33.90 (3rd). The Ladies 200 IM produced some excellent times and a small disaster when the Heeley girls' evening cards were, inadvertently, posted for the afternoon session. Late cards were accepted, but most unfortunately there was only one space in the slower heats. Sophie drew the short straw and had to watch Laura swim 2.41.32. Others: Hope 2.47.61; Jodie 2.55.45; Ellie Coe 3.18.90; Louisa 2.47.45; Hollie 2.44.50; Kate Coe 3.02.68.

In the evening more good BK swims: Lisa Coleman 43.56; Danielle Bourne 44.82; Jodie 35.93 (3rd); 200 F/S Andrew 2.17.40; Stuart Tierney 2.17.57; 200 BR Hope 3.07.42 (2nd).

DAY 3, Still going...

Our Juniors had another good day, but the Seniors were initially less impressive. Kelly Thornton's goggles filled with water in the 200 F/S and in the same event Hollie Joyce was asleep for the first 100. Laura was extremely cross to discover that she had made the final of the FLY, with a pb of 1.10.87. Why ever does she bother to train if she doesn't want to race? However, she redeemed herself later by winning the Open BR, 36.33. Kerry Wyse 39.46 (3rd); Kirsty Rostill 13/14 (3rd).

More good results from Jodie and Hope: 100 FLY Jodie 1.19.09 (1st); Hope 1.19.93 (2nd). 200 FLY Hope 3.01.27 (1st); Jodie 3.02.98 (2nd). Others: Kate Coe 100 FLY 1.25.27, F/S Hope 2.29.95; Ellie Coe 2.56.60; Sarah Thornton 2.59.77; Ellie Burke 3.07.76 and sister Jennifer 2.49.64; Louisa Ball 2.22.89; 100 F/S Clark Hands 1.13.40; Matthew Woodyatt 1.18.08; Richard Baker 1.17.60. The "man with a mission", Alastair McKenzie almost sub-60secs 1.00.48; Andrew Vale also split 28.32 to record 1.01.56; 100 BK Michael Bourne 1.10.63 (1st).

Meanwhile Laurence, who was judging, created his own excitement when he fell off his chair, grabbed the false start rope and dropped the rope into the water – luckily there was no race in progress!
