# THE SWIMMING LEAGUE

We entered this competition in 1968, finishing 3rd in Division Two, and gaining promotion to Division One. In 1969 and again in 1970 we were placed 9th=out of the 24 clubs in Division One. We had hoped to finish in the first six last year, but, in the second round, some indifferent performances and a number of disqualifications ruined our chances. CAN WE REACH THE LAST SIX IN 1971 ? It all depends on the result of the second round at Rotherhithe on February 13th. If we can take first or second place in this gala we automatically go into the 'Winners' Gala' in the third round, and are placed in the first six in the final league table. In round two we meet Southampton (208 pts), Watford (170 pts), Southwark (163 pts), Walthamstow, and Barracuda: you will recall that we scored 182 pts at Hornsey Rd. Our statisticians think that we have an excellent chance of finishing in the first two in this gala, and I am sure that they are right - don't forget that we beat Southampton in 2 of our 3 encounters last year.

Having said that, I must emphasise that it will not be at all easy. In 1970 Southampton won the League, Southwark were 4th and Watford were 10th. We can do it, however, if every member of the team makes an all-out effort. I say every member because every point is vital - in our second gala last year there were only 11 points between the 2nd and the 6th club, and we lost at least 9 points through disqualifications.

When competition is as keen as this there must be no question of disqualifications, and every place must be fought for: if you can only manage 5th in your race, you still get one more point than you would if you finished 6th, and that point might decide your club's position. We have a gala on almost every Saturday in 1971, and I regard the one on February 13th as the most important of the lot, so DO YOUR BEST!

#### THE MOTORWAY LEAGUE
