MATCH REPORTS.

16-17/12/72. Cardiff United Swim Meet.

This was held at the National Sports Centre, Sophia Gardens in Cardiff. The events were from 200m to 1500m in three age groups and covered three sessions -Saturday evening, Sunday morning and afternoon. There was a limited amount of accommodation available in the Sports Centre which cost us £2 per person for the one night and three meals. The accommodation bill together with the rail fare inevitably made it an expensive weekend, especially with Christmas so 'near, but it was valuable experience and an ideal opportunity to set targets for these long distance events in 1973.

Five swimmers from Camp Hill attended this swim meet and we covered a total of approximately 7,100m. There w re heats and finals and pennants were awarded to the first three in every event. Points were awarded to a competitor if he/she reached a final and the club with the highest points won a cup. Obviously the Club with 20 swimmers competing stood the better chance of winning outright.

All 5 of the Camp Hill swimmers achieved at least one personal best time.
