We sent a strong nucleus of swimmers to this event and all competed creditably. From the very start it was obvious that there was going to be considerable vociferous support. It was in such finishes that two out of our three individual winners gained their positions.

Our other individual winner was John Austin who dominated the race from start to finish, winning easily by over 1 second in the fast time of 36.3.

Sue Denny, after qualifying 4th. for the Girls 9yrs. BR final, swam a tramendous last 25 m to snatch second place in 46.1. In 5th place in the same race Georgina Brown turned in a very creditable 47.2 after having led the field at the half-way mark. All our finalists competed well and undoubtedly the most prolific of our non-medal winning competitors was Julian Swain who competed in three finals in the lOyr. Boys group. He amassed 10 points from his finals with one 4th and two 5th places. Had he been slightly sharper he could possibly have wen some of his events.

Other good performances came from Gary Whitson..5th in the 12yrs. Fly 35.1; Katie Long ..6th in the 12yrs. BR 40.1; Frank Edwards..4th in the 11yrs Fly 36.1, John Earl..8th in the 11yrs.F/S; Ruth Tanner..8th in the 11yrs BK and Karen Gurney ..5th in a very close 11yrs.BR.
