SWIMMING TRAINING IN AUSTRALIA AND THE U.S.A.

(Ken Thorley, an Australian schoolboy who trained with us for eight weeks, was kind enough to write us this report about his other training sessions !!)

'Having been asked to describe the 2 training squads in the U.S.A. and Australia, I will start with our squad in Epping, Sydney, where we do 10 sessions a week. Our afternoon sessions are 12 to 12 hours long, and the morning sessions are 1 to 11 hours long. Here is an example of an afternoon session:

800 F/S warm up 8 x broken 400 F/S (broken for 10 secs. at the 100's) 8 x 50's walk-backs (2 of each stroke) Across the pool sprints (17 yds.) Most sprints are across and back, although there are usually 1 or 2 longer breath control sprints, e.g. 10 acrosses without breathing diving in at each end within 10 seconds. In the mornings we usually do longer distance swimming, such as 4 x 800's or 1 or 2 x 1500's often followed by a set of 66's. Also pulleys and weights can be done before training starts. On Saturday mornings the District's swimming club runs handicap races ranging from 33yds. (for beginners) to 200m. On Tuesday nights the club alternates 400 F/S one week with 200 medleys the next. All races are handicapped with a seasonal point score for each event and age championship at the end of the season.

As the pool is a 50m. outdoor pool (not heated) training lasts from October to Easter. The price for coaching is about 29 per 4 weeks.

The 2nd place we have trained at is the Starlit Aquatic Club near Washington D.C. where they train 11 times a week and cover a much greater mileage. During the school terms they train for an hour in the mornings and 2½ hrs. in the evenings, while in the holidaysthey do 3 hrs. in the morning and 2 hrs in the afternoon. Here are two examples : 20/6/77 Morning

1500 Warm-Up 500 F/S, then 5 x 200 arms on 2.45 2400 3 x 800 F/S on 101 mins. 1800 18 x 100's 1st one up choice, backF/S on 1.50. 2nd one F/S on 1.40 (not slower than 1.15) 3rd one on 1.15 (repeat that 6 times)

1600 KICK 6 x 100 on 2 mins. Then do 200 F/S (whole stroke)
Repeat all that twice.
100 Easy 100
2,400 4 sets of 3 x 200 arms. 1st and 3rd sets on 2.45
(HARD) 2nd and 4th sets on 3 mins. (EASY)
200 Flat-out 100 kick, then easy 100 F/S to finish off.
Total 10,000m

23/6/77 Afternoon

1600 Warm-up 800 F/S and backwards 800 medley.
3200 4 x 800 F/S all broken in the following way:
No. 1 unbroken. No. 2 at the 400's on 6.15. No. 3 at the
200's on 3 mins. No. 4 at the 100's on 1.25
500 with pull buoy and tyre, up B/Fly, back F/S
400 8 x 50 kick on 1.05. All hard except every 3rd one.
Total: 5700m

They do a dry-land exercise circuit 3 times a week consisting of 15 x 45 second stations of different exercises. They also do 5 minutes of flexibility exercises before each session - stretching arms and legs. This particular squad is in the top 16 in the U.S. As is usually the case in that country you have to pay for the opportunity to swim; 190 family membership + about 121 per month, which enables the family to use the pool and tennis and golf facilities.
