Twenty-five of us left Heathrow on Monday, 17th July, accompanied by five officials including Miss Jackson, our chaperone. We all had been issued with navy blue, red and white track-suits and two swimming costumes. Four hours and fifteen minutes later we were in Istanbul where we were to change planes to fly on to Izmir. We did not notice the heat at this stage because by then it was 9p.m., and 11 30p.m. by the time we reached Izmir.

All the teams were housed in the University City., a big campus patrolled by guards day and night to stop the local men from getting in to steal and also from molesting the girls ! All Turkish women lead a very restricted life until they are about twenty. We were not supposed to leave the dempus unless chaperoned and we were issued with a pass and identity card for moving in and out of the competition areas.

The topening ceremony was on Wednesday when everyone turned out in full team kit and paraded around the Stadium. Dancers from the other counties gave a display. The swimming was held in a 50 metre open air pool which was very nice and the first three or four days were spent training. We were allowed to go shopping twice, but the rest of the time, apart from training was spent on the campus, so we did not see much of the local area. The beach at Izmir was out of bounds because of pollution and we were not allowed to sunbathe, because it could sap our energy. The food was hot and spicey and not very interesting but we ate shish kebabs and peaches. Unfortunately nearly everyone picked up a tummy bug so by the end of the week we were

not feeling our best. The swimming events took place over two days - he'ats in the morning and finals at night. Times were very competitive but we ended up with 5 firsts 4 seconds and 3 thirds. Approximately 15 countries took part and every time a "urkish swimmer made a final the crowd went mad.

Miss Jackson was always on hand with plasters and TCP for all minor problems and when there was a power cut on the last night., she came round like Florence Nightingale with an electric torch and not a lamp.
