1/4/79. Stockport Metro.

This match coming but one day after the National Short Course could have been somewhat of an anti-climax. It was not...it proved a highly exciting gala with our final victory dependant upon a victory over hosts Stockport Metro in the very last race. The match was close right from the very 1st race 'Excitement ratings' in a match like this are determinable by examining the faces of the coaches. Was it relevant that FGT's hair went grey?(perhaps old age)

More important was the swimming Hayley Bettinson cruised to victories in the 100m Fly 69.6 (Club Record) and 100m F/S 62.7 and finally needed to turn on some power in the relays to ensure continued success in the senior girls events. In the Boys 16/U F/S Paul Woodall powered his way to a 57.3 against very strong opposition and later repeated the performance in the BK in 67.3. After numerous years of drought we finally have lady BR swimmers. Jo Seymour easily coasted to victory in the Open BR in 80.6 soon followed by Melanie Hayward winning the 16/U BR in 81.9.

The atmosphere of the competition was similar to that of the Grand National the day before. This may sound excessive but 'pool side punters' were rife. Joanne Swift lost 10p to Paul Ford on the result of the 14/U F/S races in which she and Paul were both contestants. (I'm sure David Swift 'Punter extraordinaire' wouldn't have lost!)

In the 12/U age group Georgina Brown was 2nd in the Fly (51.4) and 1st in the F/S 44.6. Sue Denny won the BR 57.4 and Debbie Fielding BK 54.0. The boys were not quite so prolific but Simon Mason was 2nd in the Br in 57.9.

The relays proved our real strength. The unfortunate lack of 14/U boys however provided difficulties. Throughout the gala we had maintained 2nd place just a few points behind Stockport. We caught those points up on almost every relay until we came to the 14/U boys. Here, despite valiant efforts by our depleted, under-age squad we were 5th and 6th whereas Stockport were 1st both times. This put us back 5 points each time. We won the majority of the realys; in fact 11 out of 17.

The open relays proved very exciting with the girls winning both of theirs and the men winning one and arriving 2nd in the F/S relay. One problem arose here which resulted in a toss up for last place in the IM relay between myself and FGT...I lost...so had to swim....spectators were thus saved the 'vision' of FGT's perfect technique. The 16/U age group proved our most successful, we remained undefeated in these relays with powerful swims by Paul Woodall to give the boys two good victories.

The climax of the gala was the very last race. This was a mixed Cannon with 2 boys and 2 girls from every age-group. We went into this race with the same number of points as Stockport and maintained a very slight lead throughout the 16 swimmers to finally touch home victors of the race and thus the gala.

We returned to Birmingham with a shield, awarded to Hayley for innumerable stirring swims throughout the gala, many good performances and FGT making a mental note to take Grecian 2000 to the next gala (I'm sure many of the spectators needed it also!)
