12th/14th June - Welsh Long Course. Heidi Perry 1st 100 BK 69.15; 2nd 200 BK 2.27.61.Jo Swift Jun.F/s Champion 62.29; 2nd junior in 200, 2.16.15.

Heidi's swim got her a week's holiday (?) in Chiasso, where she competed in the Annual International Meet and in an International match setting a P.B. of 2.25.7 in the 50m pool. Jo narrowly missed selection for that event but I am pleased to place on record that she has been selected for the Welsh Youth Squad again.

National Short Course Championships, Barnet 1st/4th April.

Following our excellent Midlands Short Course I was looking for good swims here, but our small contingent in the main put up average performances with the exception of Jo Seymour whose fine swim in the 100m Br., placing 2nd in 73.05, earned her selection for the G.B. Senior Team. Jo also placed 4th in the 200 BR and was 10th in the 200 I.M. Her swim in the first match against West Germany and Holland earned her selection for the remaining matches v. USSR in Kiev and v. Italy in Blackpool. Jo also was the only English girl winner in the Eight Nations Youth Contest in Sweden, and won her event in the Schools' International. An exhausting programme when you add on olub events etc. but more was to come and did at Leeds in August.

Optrex National Long Course Championships 6th/9th August. Thursday 6th

The morning session had Jo Seymour and Andrew Beavan in the 200m ER and EK respectively, Jo qualifying for the Grand Final and Andrew doing a pleasing time of 2.15.07, qualifying for the consolation final. Andrew was disappointed in his final not to better his heat time and finished in 8th place in 2.16.43 Jo feeling much the same with her final time of 2.45.67 when she achieved 4th place.

Friday 7th.

Jo swam again today in the 200 I.M. and with a heat time of 2.30.53 got a place in the consolation final. The morning also had the heats of the 4 x 100m Women's Relay Team in which C/Hill were competing with two young swimmers who were aware of the prestige that a "Final" place would bring. Lisa Capewell and Jo Swift both gave creditable performances. Heidi Perry and Jo Seymour gave us a good start to the race and Lisa took over to swim a personal best time(100m) of 69+ and Jo Swift with a 62+ easily earned us a place in the final. The 200 I.M. time by Joanne later in the day was a good improvement on her heattime - 2.28.52. Saturday 8th.

The Women's 100m BR was the 1st event of the day and Jo Seymour qualified for the final with a 1.16.56 and Andrew Beavan again reached the consolation final with a 1.02.63 in the 100m BK.

Andrew Small was disappointed not to make a final in the 100m BK but his time of 1.04.58 was not of his usual good quality. Saturday evening was a busy one for C/Hill - represented in three events. In the 100m BR Suki Brownsden clearly led the field but Jo Seymour took 2nd place convincingly in a time of 1.14.80. Andrew was reasonably placed in the 100m BK finishing in 4th place in 1.03.21. The Ladies 4x100m Medley Team race was the last event of the evening and the girls put together a creditable performance. Heidi swam first achieving a good placing for Joanne's take over, liss again put in a good leg and Johan took up the rear to enable C/Hill to finish in 7th place. A pleasing result.

Sunday 9th.
On the final day, Chris Tainty joined the team to swim in the 200 Men's I.M. and was quite pleased with his time of 2.18.37. Jo Seymour had the last swim of the week in the 400 I.M. and having qualified for the consolation final elected not to swim. The afternoon session saw Chris starting as a spectator and then being taken aback when called to the blocks to swim. After a mad rush to get changed and without a warm-up, he was placed 8th in a time of 2.19.98.

European Championships - Split, Yugoslavia.

Jo's consistency over the year was rewarded by selection for the G.B. Team for this event and following a fortnight's team training she was placed 6th in the consolation final with a p.b. of 74.29. Well done Jo - targets for 1982 - Brisbane and Ecuador!
