After 6 events we were lying equal with 2 other teams on 23 points with 2 others leading on 24 points. This was not going to be an easy one! By event 12 (with only one more first place coming from Flora Lee) we were 3rd, 4 points behind the leaders. Had we been over optimistic about our chances?

Three swims in the next 6 races from Adrian Lee and our boys and girls 10yrs. medley teams, however, took us into the lead by 3 points. Things were looking better. By event 24 further wins (in the 10yrs. F/S teams) increased our lead to 13 points - momentum was gathering.

After event 29 following 4 consecutive wins from Jonathan Baker, Ben Darbyshire, Sharon Morris and our girls 8 x 1 relay, we had a lead of 27 points. Nearly there.

That 8 x 1 length was a race to remember: Our lead-off, Clare Busby, stopped swimming thinking that the sounding of a hooter by an over enthusiastic spectator was a recall signal. Fortunately, she realised her mistake and chased after the others. We gradually worked our way through the field with a storming final length by Sharon placing us 1st. The guilty hooter tooter narrowly escaped a lynching from Messrs Page, Waldron and Watson and received a ticking off from the Announcer.

More wins from Jonathan and the boys 8×1 and 12 yrs. medley and with a lead of 30 points, we were in the home straight.

Jonathan won his 3rd event and victories in the boys 12 yrs. medley and the 8 x 1 Mixed, meant we had won by 40 points - GREAT STUFF - now we have to look towards Division I in 1990.
