LIVING DANGEROUSLY - SOLIHULL - 3/3/90 DIDDY RELAYS

Wins in events 1 and 2, Second in event 3, a win in event 7, Second in 8 and 9, First in 10. The points then stood at C/Hill 40, Bedworth Otters 35, Swadlincote 31, Solihull 30. What a good start, BUT after event 14 four races later - Bedworth 53, Solihull 53, Swadlincote 47, C/Hill 43. We had dropped from a 5 points lead to a 10 points deficit from 1st to 4th. This was due to 3 faulty takeovers and a swimmer finishing off the back - 4 disqualifications in 5 races!

A "flier" in a relay can be due to a bad finish by the incoming swimmer or to bad judgement by the outgoing swimmer. In either case it represents a LACK OF CONCENTRATION, and it is to be hoped that those at fault will learn from this experience. One likes to see the enthusiastic support of the other swimmers, but you must keep back as the swimmer is coming in so that the person on the block is not distracted and can concentrate.

Having decided to make life difficult, we gradually clawed our way back and retained the trophy by one point, to be defended in 1991. There were many good swims with encouraging performances from our 9 year girls in a gala which was a good trial run for the structuring of our league team.

LAWS OF THE SPORT - FREESTYLE

Freestyle means any stroke or stroke mixture - you can swim BR if you wish and do not have to worry about the rules of that stroke. You cannot swim BR, BK or FLY and claim a record if done in a F/S race.

Obviously swimmers opt for front crawl in a F/S race as that is the fastest.

- The final stage of an individual medley and of a medley relay has to be swam on front crawl.
- You may touch with any point of the body at turn and finish, but you must make that contact.

This is the only stroke where you can stand up during a race, but you
may not take a step.
