MATCH REPORTS

13 November 1993 - Round II West Midland League

It is so disappointing when the dates - the 2nd Saturdays in October, November, December, January, February and March - have been known for a year and have been included in individual fixture lists and displayed on the noticeboard.

We knew we would be up against it at Beechdale and our 5th place was all we could expect. Nevertheless, the team swam well, and our efforts resulted in many pb's, including a number by swimmers who finished 6th.

There were good team swims by the women, who averaged 29's in the 6×2 F/S and the 14/15 girls who averaged 30+ in their relay.

Rachel Nock and Trevor Clark gave the team a great start in the Open IM's with easy wins, but we failed to win any of the next 6 relays.

Nadia Rahman, with an excellent second length effort, 40.18, and Pam Schofield, 40.40 BR, won the next 2 girls' races, but we waited for 16 more races before Georgina Lee had our next win, 35.11 FLY. Jamie Hamer overhauled the opposition at the last length to win the BR, 1.14.34, and to inspire fighting finishes from Michell Wilson, F/S 32.59, and Lucy Tubbs, F/S 1.06.91, to win their races.

With 3 teams fighting for second place going into the relays, we needed extra team effort and we got it with 5 excellent wins.

Claire Franklin anchored the 11/U Medley Team to win by a fingertip and Jo Hutton came from 4th place to snatch victory for the 15/U Medley Team. The 13/U Girls F/S Team and both Open 6 x 2 Teams had easy wins. There were many other good swims, especially FLY: Georgina Lee, 1.14.85, Lucy Lloyd-Roach 40.93 and Paul Bicknell 37.72.

20/21 November 1993 - Hereford Meet

From various points in Birmingham, the party set off on a very cold frosty Saturday morning at 6.30 am for 8.00 am warm up.

Nicola set out her stall for the weekend by falling asleep en route, but immediately waking up at the first smell of food!

The pool and facilities were found to be very good and it was a popular meet with large representatives from Millfield, Borough of Kirklees, City of Coventry and Birmingham.

A long day's swimming ensued and for those who finished slightly earlier than the others, the format was Hotel (after unscheduled tour of Hereford!), MacDonalds, Children to Bed, Adults to the Bar. 27 November 1993 - Stratford (33 1/3 m)

From the outset, the team elected to win this gala and with excellent support from the balcony did so with some ease, winning 24 of the 46 events, including 5 of the 6 relays, and notably 12 out of the 16 F/S events.

Lucy Lloyd-Roach was our only 10 year winner, FLY 25.51, while Laura Payne finished 2nd by 0.2 BK due to stopping 2 metres out!

Excellent swims from Georgina Lee F/S 44.34, FLY 47.55 and 1.14.76; Ian Potter, F/S 44.10, FLY 50.20 and Damien Freeman, BR 55.82, auger well for PB's on future 100's. Our 14/U performed well with comfortable wins for usual A team members and creditable swims from Dean Cross, BR 1.28.09 and FLY 1.15.72, and Russell Turner, BK 1.15.51.

Our 15/U boys won all of their races; Jonathan Baker, F/S 58.96, FLY 1.06.23 and BR 1.18.30; David Tubbs, F/S 1.01.22 and BK 1.10.54, as did our Open girls, Lydia Lee, F/S 1.05.09 and FLY and Shelley Taylor BK 1.12.91 and BR 1.21.69.

Several initial hitches meant that the first 10 events took 45 minutes, and the gala seemed likely to end after 10.30 pm. However, re-organised officials speeded things up and the team enjoyed the unfamiliar pool and the good atmosphere.
