### COMPETITION RESULTS


9.9.94 Junior League, Round 1, Nuneaton (362, yds.)

Darren Dyke, far from fit, used his superior turning skill to take gold in the 50 & 100 F/S. Jo Potter was the most successful of our four qualifiers with a 200 BR in 2.54.10 and 400 l.M. 5.33.51. 14.5.94 Nuneaton Junior Swimming League - Round II - Halesowen (36<sup>2</sup><sub>3</sub> yds.)

A first round fifth place had left us fifth from bottom od Division 1 with only 2 points. The bottom four clubs, after the next round will be relegated to Division II. The team knew this and it was, therefore a great disappointment that so many of the boys were badly behaved, unhelpful and lacking in determination. Messing about before the start caused one boy to swim F/S in the BR leg of a relay, and several boys swam well below their best. Three good swims from Kesree Finnegan, BR 1.22.76, F/S 1.05.44, FLY 1.13.51. A second for Jo Potter, BR 1.19.66, but back to her old failing of going out too slowly in the 200 and finishing with far too much left. Strong swims from Michelie Jennings, F/S 1.04.13 3rd. & 2.17.20 2nd.; while Jonathan Baker, Fly 1.04.87, although winning still has a lot to do to make his national entry time. Adam Edwards continues to show so much talent, BK 1.06.66, but seems content to confine his effort to competitions only. Gemma Hindson had easy wins in the F/S, 1.05.00 & BK 1.12.94 and fought hard to take the FLY, 1.13.82. GEORGINA LEE swam her third National Qualifying with a 2.37.87 I.M., stroked a useful 2.37.00 200 FLY and set P.B.'s in the F/S, 1.05.76 and BK, 1.15.58. It was therefore no surprise to see her rounding off her day with a 2.38.10 200 BK.
