SUMMER BREAK

Our final session for this season will be on Saturday 23rd July. There will be some training the following week, but that will only be for the 6 swimmers who have qualified for the National Age Group. We start back on Wednesday 31st August.

WE ARE LOSING MONEY

Since the raising of the cost of a swim to £1.00, due to the increase in the pool hire charge, we have lost an average of £29.00 per week. Numbers have dropped in the past few weeks, and we must aim for regular attendance and <u>payment</u> when we start back at the end of August. Many clubs operate a system whereby payment is made to cover a certain number of sessions per week whether the swimmer attends or not and we do not wish to be forced to adopt that.

ERRATUM

OMISSION

Gemma Hindson's performances in the County events won her the trophy for the 'Female agegrouper of the year' - well done!

Georgina Lee took first place in a County Age Group Gala at Leicester, 100m. FLY in 1.10.75, and Lucy Lloyd-Roach swam well in the relays.

GOGGLES

Proper adjustment of the nose-piece is essential both for comfort and as a watertight seal. To avoid water leaks, slide the lens closer together or further apart, one notch at a time, until you get a perfect fit.

When removing goggles always hold the eye pieces and slide the goggles over the head - D0 NOT pull them away from your face, as they may spring back and hurt your eyes. If you use anti-fog goggles do not rub the inside of the lens with your fingers because this wears through the anti-fog skin, a quick rinse in the pool will suffice.

Always take at least two pairs of your favourite goggles to galas. Try not to borrow or lend goggles: your own goggles will have moulded to your face and may not suit another swimmer.

2nd/5th June '94 Guernsey Meet (25m.)

Our performances

Mike - He always swims well at Guernsey - it must be the air. P.B's in the 200 F/S, 2.03.77; 200 FLY, 2.15.72 (3rd). He should have won the BR after leading all the way and losing 1st place by a hundredth of second, but with his best time for a long time, 1.09.53. He won the 100 FLY in an excellent P.B. of 1.00.65.

Jonathan - 1st in the FLY, 1.04.64 and the 50 F/S, 26.28. Jon did enough in his other events to be overall points winner in the 15/16 group.

Adam - Yet again he showed his ability in a P.B. and National Qualifying Time in winning the BK, 1.04.48, and was 3rd in the 50 F/S, 26.64, but lack of stamina affected his other results.

Gemma - 1st in FLY, F/S, 1.03.41, I.M., all in Meet records and in the BR, and as group winner increasing her stock of holdalls and towels, etc.

Nicola - She is producing some useful times: F/S 1.12.47, I.M. 3.02.07, BR 1.27.30.

Pam - Her best swims were in the F/S, 30.30 and 1.07.78, but she needs to work out a satisfactory breathing pattern for her 100 F/S.

Kate - Her best swims were in the F/S, 1.19.37, and I.M., 3.13.99.

This important last round of the League was a big improvement on the previous two. The boys especially showed a much greater determination and were noticeably better behaved. Three boys were disqualified for faulty strokes, after making valiant efforts in their races - doubtless correct decisions, but we felt that they were somewhat harsh. (Conversely, Jonathan Sheasby was not disqualified on a backstroke length in which he swam into the lane rope, thought he had finished - appeared to turn over and put his feet down and then finished the race.)

The other disqualification was a 'flyer' by a 9yr old boy who has done it more than once previously. He must cease pestering the team manager about going home and concentrate on the task in hand.

The 10 yr boys swam close to their best, and Tom Jeffries, now making much more effort, took 212 secs. off his F/S time.

The most improved 11 yr swimmer was Christopher Gregory who successfully negotiated a backstroke turn in his first 2 length race and also took 2 sees. off the BK and F/S one length times.

The 12 yr girls bowed out with a fine flourish winning all 4 individuals, both relays and contributing to winning the girls 8x1 cannon.

Well done everyone - we are safe from relegation this year.

Five of our competitors came away with medals from this prestigious event.

Jo Potter, 200 BR 2.51.75 - 2nd, 100 BR 1.20.52 - 3rd, and good efforts in 50 BR, 36.76, and the l.M.'s, 2.36.67 and 5.30.18.

Georgina Lee, 400 I.M. 5.36.17 - 1st, 200 FLY 2.33.07 - 1st, 100 FLY 1.11.82 - 3rd, 50 FLY 32.83 - 3rd. Also P.B.'s in F/S, 1.05.87 and 30.60 and BK, 1.15.75. Her fifth place in the points for her age group would have been raised to third had she not missed a swim in the F/S final due to a recording error, which was not rectified before her departure home.
