1st/5th August 1994 - NATIONAL AGE GROUP - COVENTRY (50m.)

This was an exhausting week with much journeying to and from Coventry, although I did once travel via Euston for a change. Our competitors swam well, with Jo Potter in 9th place, narrowly missing a place in the final of the 15 yrs. 200 BR. Gemma Hindson maintained her steady improvement with a 2nd in the 400 F/S, 4.49.46, 3rd in the 100 F/S, 1.03.93 and 4th in the 200 I.M., 2.37.72.

Georgina Lee swam p.b.'s of 2.38.82 and 5.34.12 in the I.M.s and her 6th place in the final of the 100 FLY, 1.10.11, augured well for her last race the 200 FLY where her really determined swim resulted in a win in 2.31.30 - our first winner since 1987. WELL DONE GEORGINA!

Hannah Loftus won the 12yr F/S, 33.78 and improved to 33.29 in the F/S Relay. Dean Cross stood out from our boys/men, winning the 16yr FLY 1.12.56 and he also swam a comfortable F/S, 1.04.78.
