When the Camp Hill Schools' Pool was built in 1972 the Club officially became mixed



He is as delighted with some improvement by the newest, youngest swimmer as he was with various internationals he has coached over the years.

There are no general items this month, so we go straight into:

MATCH REPORTS

4/5.2.95 Bilston Meet - Wolverhampton (25m.)

Wolverhampton suits us. Our latest visit produced many P.B.s and good swims. Michelle Jennings, F/S 1.03.16 & 2.16.71, is edging towards a 62+, and David Tubbs, F/S 58.03, is consistently under the minute: he must now aim to make every swim under 58.0. David's BK is also improving with a 1.05.95. It was good to see Jo Potter really working throughout the 200 BR to win in 2.43.51, and her 400 I.M., 5.19.15, is moving well in the right direction. Katie Smith is now swimming 1.16.0 + FLY consistently and would have recorded 1.15 + but for an over-emphatic touch at the finish. Hannah Loftus has now become a sub 80 secs. backstroker, and Ruth Fraser's F/S, 1.10.46, was good, and I am sure that she now appreciates the need for greater fitness in order to swim a good heat and final. Georgina Lee swam P.B.s in a wide range of events, F/S 1.03.70, BR 1.21.42 & 2.54.15, FLY 1.08.55 & 2.28.55, BK 1.12.19 and I.M. 5.24.04. Equally versatile, Gemma Hindson swam F/S 2.14.60 & 4.41.82, I.M. 5.31.66, BR 1.23.85 & 2.56.02. Ian Potter, looking stronger, F/S 1.05.30, FLY 1.14.82. Stephen Tomlinson, who clearly needs more races, BK 1.03.83, is approaching his old form. Louise Morgan, BR 1.34.72, continues to show ability but she needs more work. Kesree Finnegan, at last ventured beyond the boundaries of 100m and raced an introductory 400 F/S in 4.51.45. Kate Hindson shows promise on FLY, 1.28.24 and Lucy Lloyd-Roach had several good efforts, FLY 1.18.24 & 2.55.42, BK 2.21.49, F/S 1.12.42.

11/12.2.95 Welsh A.S.A. Dragon Meet - Cardiff (50m.)

Our two girls produced some good efforts in their first long course competition of the year. In the U/16 group Georgina Lee swam best times in the FLY, 1.09.21 & 2.30.06, narrowly missing G.B. junior selection, and useful times in the I.M., 2.35.42 & 5.29.59. Gemma Hindson, U/13 group collected medals in several events, with best times in the FLY 1.14.02 & 2.38.92 and 400 I.M., 5.30.09.

Simon Delves declined an individual event, but swam two 'scorching' 26's in the relays, and Duncan Adams, with a 30.61 relay swim, showed that it is still not too late for him to get down to it and earn an individual race.

Jo Potter, 400 F/S 4.50.76 - a very even swim, 2.25.37 & 2.25.29 and FLY 1.13.64. Jon Sheasby, F/S 34.69 - he needs to attack that first length. William Barker 1.17.64 - better turns will reduce his times. Damien Freeman, BR 1.21.55 - he really should be aiming for a sub - 80secs. Lucy Lloyd-Roach, FLY 1.18.75 - she is consistently swimming sub 80 and must now aim for 76 secs. 18.3.95 Diddy Gala - Rugby (3313 m.)

With the Junior League getting ever closer, this match was used to provide information towards future team selection, with swimmers being tried on a variety of strokes. Congratulations to our 9 yr olds who did well in the long pool and were very well behaved.

Our best swim came from Lucy Lloyd-Roach, 2 length FLY 50.18. I was pleased too by Edward Freeman's BR, 31.31 and Sally Jones swam a good BK, 1.01.00, but should borrow a club cap rather than turn out in a yellow training cap. There were a number of 'capless' swims and I would urge parents to support our efforts to get a good team image. Good BR swims from Louise Morgan, 59.96, although she still fails to get into her stroke early enough, and from James Venables, 58.78. There were several good relay swims including: Georgina Cross, 25.78 and Jenny Pearce, 21.82, Chris Gregory 23.43 and brother Stephen, BK 28.68. Sophie Mayor had three useful relay swims. It is pleasing to note that our feeder group at Edgbaston High is producing results.

25.3.95 County Championships and Age Group Competitions - Coventry (50m.)

The day's programme consisted of three sessions, commencing at 10.30 a.m. The first gala seemed interminable with lengthy hold-ups, whereas the second one was really hectic with very little rest between swims. No wonder that we were all wilting by the start of session 3 at 6.00 p.m. Yet this was to provide our most exciting race with **Georgina Lee** and **Gemma Hindson** taking 1st and 2nd in the Girls 13/14 F/S, 1.03.17 & 1.03.27 National Qualifying Times. This was proof that, providing one has trained hard and prepared correctly - even if fatigued at the end of a long tiring day - it is possible with determination to produce a really good swim.

Other medals were won by: **Jo Potter**, 2nd in OPEN <u>BR</u> 1.20.75 *; **Gemma**, 2nd 200 <u>F/S</u> 2.15.36 (NQT); **Georgina**, 1st OPEN 50 <u>FLY</u> 31.79 *; and 3rd 200 <u>BK</u> 2.33.56 (NQT); **Stephen Tomlinson** 3rd 50 <u>BK</u> 30.41.

The end of an era

In future, all League Galas will be swum on the same dates. The EML and the WML will be on the second Saturdays in October, November and December. Teams have been allocated on a regional basis, so we shall be competing in the WML.

Sadly, this ends our long-standing association with the EML which was originally called the Motorway League. We joined that league in 1970, so have been members for a quarter of a century. We were league winners or runners-up several times, and represented the League in the National League Finals on a number of occasions. At the time, we were also swimming in the London League, and were founder members of the WML in 1972.
