I have to say that I am far from happy with the attitude to training of several of our boys, indeed, I cannot recall it ever being so poor. Naturally it is reflected in poor competition performances. I have no criticism of the effort put into races, but I am dismayed by your preparation. THINK ABOUT IT!

2.9.95 Coventry Sprints (50m.)

Our small team did well to finish fourth in the top club points total. <u>FLY</u> was our most successful stroke: **Jon Baker**, 27.46 1st; **Warren Jones**, 34.46 1st - a very determined effort right from the starting signal - in future he must maintain this approach to <u>all</u> his races; **Lucy Lloyd-Roach**, 35.94 - doing very well after surfacing in 8th place following a wasteful start; **Kesree Finnegan**, 33.37 3rd; **Paul Bicknell**, 32.02 4th - after this he should be looking for a sub 70 s. 100m. <u>F/S</u> **Jon**, 25.69 1st; **Pam Schofield**, 30.03 3rd; **Nicola Sheasby**, 30.26 3rd. <u>BR</u> **Robert Delves**, 39.77; **Nicola**, 40.15. <u>BK</u> **Stephen Tomlinson**, 30.37 1st.

Good swims from Ian Johnstone and Jon Sheasby in the 10/12 yr events: Jonathan's rankings in the 10 yr. group, <u>BR</u> 3rd, <u>FLY</u> & <u>F/S</u> 1st, <u>BK</u> 2nd, promises well for the future.

10.9.95 Triple S Meet - Stechford (25m.)

This 'Age on the day' Meet was just right for **Jon Baker**, who shared the top boy prize, winning 4 of his 5 events and recording some good times: <u>FLY</u> 1.02.66, <u>BK</u> 1.05.56, <u>I.M.</u> 1.04.67, <u>BR</u> 1.13.28. Medals were awarded to the first 3 places, and we collected 28 of them - too many to list - and won the 'Top Club' trophy. The performance of our almost full strength team in this first round, although encouraging in many aspects, underlined the fact that only a 100% effort and 100% concentration in the next round will enable us to qualify for the final.

It was a gala of conflicting fortunes: after 13 events we were a comfortable 2nd to Coventry and 8 points ahead of Solihull, but by event 40 we had crashed to 22 points behind Solihull. The gap was too great to be closed, but our relay teams responded well to leave us within 8 points of Solihull at the end.

Georgina continued to swim very competitively on <u>FLY</u>, finishing 3rd to 2 international swimmers in the 200m., 2.24.58 & the 100m., 1.06.62, collecting 2 senior bronze and 2 junior gold medals. It was good to have teams competing again after a lapse of several years, and to have **Jo Minion** swimming in both with a creditable 1.11.01 <u>BK</u>, also producing a good 28.73 in the individual 50 F/S.
