JUNIOR INTERNATIONAL - England v. Germany - Gelnhausen 19th/20th Dec.

We had to be at Heathrow by 11.15, which meant catching the Flights coach from Birmingham at 6.30a.m. The plane left on time, and we arrived in Frankfurt 2 hours later (1 hour time difference). We then travelled for a further hour in a coach to Gelnhausen, and finally arrived at the picturesque Hotel Burg-Muhle. The building was large, woodpanelled and laced with snow. Although most of us were exhausted, some having set off even earlier than I, we only had time to drop our bags before being bundled off to the pool for a training session and 'pool familiarisation'.

We had a lovely evening meal of roast chicken, potatoes and broccoli and went to bed ready to face the Germans on the following day. Morning brought a breakfast of ham, cheese and pineapple chunks. We arrived at the pool, warmed up, and then had the opening ceremony: this consisted of two members of each team being photographed beneath a huge German flag and a tiny Union Jack, whilst the anthems were played.

There were some very good swims over the two days, and the girls just beat the boys in our team competition. Although England were ahead almost throughout, there were some tense moments, and we were relieved to win the competition by 10 points.

On Wednesday night there was a disco, which was the first chance we had to talk to the Germans. They were really friendly and good at dancing, and the boys, although all extremely long haired, were very good looking.

I had a wonderful time in Germany and arrived home in time to change for my brother's 21st birthday party - what a week!

Warren Jones still needs to improve the 2nd 50 on all strokes, but his FLY, 1.18.26, is moving in the right direction.
