We always seem to perform well in this event and this year was no exception. Details of our medals will be listed in the next 'News' but here are a few reflections on the performances. Our 12/U boys did surprisingly well in view of their somewhat erratic training, with Jon Sheasby taking bronze in the F/S, 1.08.00. We then have to move up to the 17/18 & Open with mostly 'standard' swims. There was a pleasing win in the Men's F/S Team and Jon Baker had a good win in the 50 FLY, 27.23. David Woodhall picked up more medals in the FLY rather than in his main stroke and Steve Dunn showed that he can still compete with a 26.00 in the F/S Team.

Kate Hindson was a quadruple winner in the 12 yr. girls, and Sally Jones and Rachel McLaughlin produced good sprints. Ruth Fraser had some encouraging swims and Lucy Lloyd-Roach did very well in her FLY swims. Gemma Hindson was the overall Age Group Champion, collecting many medals and showing marked improvement in her FLY and BK races. Georgina Lee was in a highly competitive mood typified by her winning the Open FLY & F/S, 1.01.11, with only three races separating them. Jo Potter collected some BR medals, but I thought her 1.13.86 FLY was her best swim. Hayley Bettinson showed that she can still tackle a long course sprint with a strong 'anchor' swim in our winning F/S Team.

Discipline was good with one exception - a 13 and a 14 yr. girl playing about in the nappy changing room and being reprimanded.
