JUNIOR LEAGUE (I still prefer 'DIDDY').

13.4.96 Round One - Solihull (331, m.)

This was a depressing start to our league competition, with the only bright spots being the two relay wins by our 9 yr. boys, **Stuart Tierney**, **Tim Sheasby**, **Andrew Vale** and **Michael Bourne**. **Kate Hindson** won the <u>BR</u> and was second in the <u>FLY</u>, 50.23 and Jon **Sheasby** won the <u>F/S</u> and was second in the <u>FLY</u>.

11.5.96 Round Two - Stratford (3313 m.)

Perry Beeches 232, Cheadle 169, Avon Neptunes 148, Broadway 134, C/Hill 113, Dove Valley 102.

This was slightly better than the previous round, but the result still left us very close to bottom place in the Division, and requiring a big effort in the final round to avoid relegation.

15.6.96 Round Three - Cannock (3313 m.)

Haden Hill 312, Phoenix Youth 166, Avon Neptunes 154, C/Hill 151, Bilston 150, Stourport 62.

After the first two rounds, Camp Hill had only 3 points out of a possible 12 and was in real danger of relegation. We had to come at least 4th to have any chance of remaining in Division 1.

On a lovely sunny evening the swimmers assembled on the grass outside the pool for a team talk from F.G.T. Clearly his words sank in, for there followed a most determined effort by everyone to avoid the indignity of Division 2. It was a most exciting and closely fought gala. Haden Hill was always likely to win and Stourport to come last, but the other four teams were evenly matched. After 24 events, 3 of the 4 had 83 points each, and at the end of the gala only 16 points separated all 4. Camp Hill lost to Avon Neptunes by 3 points but, crucially, beat Bilston by a single point. Never have the words "Every point counts", been more appropriate. Rarely has it been so important to avoid disqualification.

Jo Loder and Richard Pilsbury each swam a length of FLY which they would have much preferred not to have done, but both gained the one vital point.

There are 43 events in the Junior League programme, and 14 of these were swum in times better than the previous round. Interesting improvement was shown by the same 12 yr. girls, who went 4 secs. faster in the <u>F/S</u> relay and 5 secs. faster in the medley relay, to place 1st in both races.

The greatest individual improvement was shown by Carol Pestridge, who recorded p.b.'s of 3 secs for <u>BK</u> 29.60 and 5 secs. for two length <u>BK</u>.

Other good swims: Hannah Massey, <u>F/S</u> 23.34 (placing 2nd in the first event and getting the club off to a good start) and a p.b. of 3 secs. in the <u>BK</u> 29.70. Fleur Green, two length <u>FLY</u> a 2 sec. p.b. 1.07.80 and two length <u>BR</u> 1.09.70, her first <u>BR</u> race at that distance making her our fastest 11 yr. James Paterson (coming out of retirement) <u>BK</u> 29.08, <u>F/S</u> 23.46. Ewan Martin two length <u>BR</u> p.b. 1.00.31, one of only 6 winners, the others being Kate Hindson, Jon Sheasby (2), and the girls 12 yr. relay team (2).

Well done everyone and good luck for next year (still) in Division 1!

GUERNSEY (25m)

On the same weekend 7 swimmers represented Camp Hill at Guernsey. Jon Sheasby took the 'top swimmer' award in his age group; his good swims including 2 Meet Records, 50 F/S 30.44, 100 FLY 1.16.99. Ian Johnstone also did well with F/S times 33.50 & 1.12.45. Rob Delves won the 50 F/S, 28.83 and swam a good BK 1.14.31. Chris Hutton reaped the reward for his hard training with a number of good efforts and 'came of age' as a swimmer with his F/S 1.00.70. Ruth Fraser also had good swims including 30.98 F/S. Lucy Lloyd-Roach swam 2.45.72 200 FLY and 2.25.39 F/S. Nicola Sheasby won the F/S, 28.74, swam a sound 200, 2.20.66 and good BR times, 1.22.79 and 3.00.51. Thanks are due to Polly Sheasby and Sue Johnstone for looking after the trip - our 5th or 6th. Do we send a team next year?

11/12th May '96 Midland Masters - Leamington (25m.)

After months of persuading, arm-twisting etc., I eventually succeeded and we actually had 15 swimmers in action. The result - medals galore: Trevor Clark (4); Claire Duffy (3), 200 BR 2.56.07; Lynn Clark (1); Hayley Bettinson (7), including FLY 32.55; Susanne Linton (4); Norman Stephens (1); Darren Dyke (2), 50 F/S 26.24, 100 F/S 55.22; Alan Cooper (4); David Beavan (2); Mike Hoare (3), FLY 1.02.32.

Kevin Woodward, Debbie Bees and Jason Neale came over to complete our teams. Seven of our eight teams were 1st, with the remaining one 3rd where possibly a different age mixture would have given us a clean sweep. The lynching party was ready to deal with Paul Seymour, after his take-over, but someone must have distracted the judges, so he was spared. Cost of team entries \$48.00.

<u>Trevor Clark</u> won several events at the Leeds Masters and, at the Great Britain Masters he had one 1st, 50 <u>BK</u> 31.53, two 2nds and three 3rds. He must feel very frustrated at having to miss the World Masters because of back injury and we all hope that he will be back in action in the new season.

20/21st April Wolverhampton Meet (25m.)

We had several p.b.'s during the two days and a good crop of medals. The Hindsons each won 6 events, including: Gemma FLY 1.10.13, F/S 1.01.13, 200 2.10.72. Kate's best times were: an extremely well paced 800 10.19.90, BR 1.25.35, 400 4.58.71 and 200 BR 3.03.91. Jon Sheasby is getting to appreciate the Wolverhampton pool, and swimming up a year he took 5 medals, 50m. 2nd 30.27, 100 3rd 1.05.83, and an excellent 200 F/S 2.23.13. Sally Jones did well on her three strokes, BK 1.20.47, FLY 1.22.61, F/S 1.08.84, 50 F/S 31.50 2nd. Georgina Lee's CLUB JUNIOR RECORD in the 200 BK 2.26.93 looked too easy and augured well for the 200 I.M. which she won in a respectable 2.26.08. Her CLUB JUNIOR RECORD of 1.00.12 F/S took her that bit closer to the sub 60 secs.

Gemma Hindson, FLY 31.55 1st, F/S 29.21 4th; Nicola Sheasby, F/S 30.41 7th, after a casual heat swim necessitated a swim-off for 8th place in the final; Pam Schofield, F/S 30.10 6th; Kesree Finnegan, FLY 32.02 5th.

25th/27th May 1996 Sheffield Grand Prix (50m.)

This busy weekend had Grand Prix heats a.m. and age group races in the afternoon, with finals for both in the evening. Georgina Lee produced our best result with two excellent swims in the 100 FLY. Her heat time, a CLUB RECORD, of 1.04.58 was just outside the European Junior Qualifying Time, but her 6th place in the final, 1.04.46 achieved that EUROPEAN JUNIOR TIME. Gemma Hindson swam 3 p.b.'s in the 14 yr. group, F/S 1.00.97 2nd, 200 I.M. 2.28.78 1st, and FLY 1.08.03 2nd; sister Kate was 7th in the 12 yr. BR with a N.A.G. qualifying time of 1.25.80; Nicola Sheasby won her F/S heat, 1.04.80; Lucy Lloyd-Roach swam a FLY p.b. of 1.14.20 7th. Jon Sheasby's disqualification at the start cost him first place in the 11 yr. F/S and the Speedo bag prize, but a gutsy swim in the FLY, 1.15.61 1st, enabled him to collect that bag.
