Georgina and Lucy Lloyd-Roach swam for Warwickshire recently in the Lombardian Trophy Gala. They will be joined by Jo Potter and Gemma Hindson in the County Team for the A.S.A. Inter-Counties Competition at Sheffield on the 19th October.

Gemma Hindson and Jon Baker have been selected for the Division 6 Team for the English Schools Championships at Luton.

29/30th June & 6/7th July '96 Midland A.S.A. Age Group - Coventry

It was so good to see a <u>BOY</u> from Camp Hill on the rostrum. **Jon Sheasby** showed great maturity in all his races, winning the three <u>F/S</u> events, 1.05.70, 2.22.61 (both competition best times) and 5.05.52. He also took 2nd in the <u>FLY</u>, 1.15.33 and the <u>LM</u>, 2.49.78, placing 2nd overall in his age group.

Gemma Hindson won six events, <u>FLY</u> 1.09.85 and 2.30.01, <u>I.M.</u> 5.20.57, 400 <u>F/S</u> 4.39.03, 800 9.36.40, with her best swim in the 200 <u>F/S</u> 2.11.16. These results won her the prize for her group.

Georgina Lee was also the champion of her group, taking gold in the 200 <u>FLY</u> in a competition best time of 2.22.80, and in the <u>I.M.</u> 5.15.41. She also improved her <u>BK</u> times, 2.31.50 - 2nd and 1.10.44.

Jo Potter was 3rd in the 200 <u>BR</u>, 2.49.46. **Kate Hindson** swam several events, placing 5th in <u>FLY</u> & <u>BR</u>. **Ewan Martin** swam a good <u>F/S</u> of 1.13.81, as did **Lucy Lloyd-Roach**, 2.26.91. **Ruth Fraser** reaped the reward for better concentration in training with a F/S swim of 1.06.27.

Kesree Finnegan had some good races, including <u>FLY</u>, 1.11.83, but I felt that the cessation of a.m. training had taken the edge off her distance <u>F/S</u>.

20.7.96 Inter-Club Wellington (25m.)

We came up against some surprisingly strong opposition in this end-of-season match, having to be content with third place. Many thanks to those who swam at short notice, and, as usual, some good swims to place on record.

There were a number of encouraging BK swims: Lucy Lloyd-Roach 37.27; Hannah Loftus 1.18.96; Paul Bicknell 1.14.59. Lloyd Griffiths had a good win in the F/S, 57.60.

29th July/3rd August '96 National Age Group - Crystal Palace (50m.)

We only had three qualifiers this time, with the following results:

Kate Hindson, BR 1.26.00

Gemma Hindson was 6th in the <u>F/S</u>, 1.01.73, 5th in the 400 <u>I.M.</u>, 5.17.21 with her best swim in the 200 <u>I.M.</u>, when, having qualified 7th for the final, she swam a most determined race to take the bronze medal. Her swims gained her a place on the Swim 2000 scheme for a third year.

Georgina Lee took advantage of the long course pool to spend time preparing for the following week's European Junior Championships. She did, however, swim her two FLY events. In the 100 she was placed 4th taking the silver medal as the first two to finish were South Africans. In the 200, Georgina qualified fastest and won a very exciting final in a Competition best time of 2.20.22, with the South African girls 2nd and 3rd.

A few week's rest and then back to racing!

7/9/96 Coventry 50m. Sprints

Trophies were awarded to the first three finalists. **Jon Baker** won the <u>F/S</u>, 25.98 and the <u>FLY</u>, 27.75 - he looked very good raising hopes that he may turn his attention to 100m. events this season. **Nicola Sheasby** was 2nd in the <u>F/S</u>, 29.87, as was brother **Jonathan**, 30.10, and **Pam Schofield** was also 2nd with a brisk 29.88.

Katie Brooks, Sally Jones, 32.21, Rachel McLaughlin, 32.70; Lucy Lloyd-Roach and Chris Hutton had good FLY swims 33.52 and 32.07 respectively.

This first gala of the Autumn term clashed with the Coventry Sprints, so a number of regular team members were unavailable. As a result, people were often swimming up an age group (or two in the case of 12 yr Neil Davies who swam in both 16 yr relays) and Paul Bicknell, as our only 16 yr boy had a very busy evening indeed.

Of the eight swimmers in our 10 yr teams, six were still 9 yr olds, gaining valuable experience for the Junior League next spring. Despite being so under age, the girls relay teams finished 2nd and 3rd, which was most encouraging.

28.9.96 Trophy Gala - Cheadle (36²3 m.) C/Hill 233, Cheadle 226, Radford 202, Etwell Eagles 174, Bicester 150

This was a satisfying win early in the season. We were second to Cheadle throughout the evening until event 43, when we drew level. Thereafter we won 5 of the remaining 7 relays to clinch the match. There were no outstanding swims, but several happenings of note:

Kate Hindson travelled to Harlow in search of distance events and had some good results, including a bronze in the 400m. F/S.

6.10.96 Haden Hill Diddy Meet - Wolverhampton (25m.)

Our team of 10 swimmers did well to finish 4th out of the 25 clubs competing in this Meet. Kate Hindson got us off to a good start with a win in the 200 I.M., 2.43.55 and was 2nd in the BR, 1.26.16. She also won some paint brushes in the tombola. Jon Sheasby set 'competition bests' in the 50 F/S, 29.75 and the 100m. I.M., 1.18.35.

Lucy Lloyd-Roach was our other winner with a 1.14.74 FLY, also swimming a best F/S time of 1.07.83. Sally Jones had some respectable swims, but still runs out of steam on the final length. Ian Johnstone tried very hard, including good times of 2.55.00, I.M. and 1.12.91, F/S. Ewan Martin sprinted well, F/S 33.70, BK 39.68 and Ruth Fraser swam her best F/S, 1.05.72. Hannah Massey swam BK, 44.15 and F/S 38.58, but dodged the FLY 'to conserve her strength'! Stuart Baker improved his times with F/S 37.80 and BR 48.30. Carl Reed swam a useful FLY, 38.87 and did a F/S 'display race' with his goggles in his hand instead of in the correct place.
