We were 2 points behind Rugby with the 2 Open 6x2 relays to swim: we won the women's race, and triumphed again in the men's, thanks to the presence of our older swimmers. Equal on points, after a count-back on 1st places, we were announced as gala winners. However, we later found that the count-back is not used to resolve a tie in the third round, it being decided on the total of points gained in the three rounds. Never mind, it was an exciting finish.

4.1.97 Relay Trophy Gala - Wolverhampton (25m.)

This first gala of 1997 was rather inconveniently held before either school or training had resumed after Christmas, but it turned out to be well worth the effort. Although we only finished 4th, it was excellent experience for our new 9 yr. olds, who all tried their best and behaved very well.

With 6 girls and 5 boys in that age group, we did well to have only 2 disqualifications, neither avoidable. One for declaring an ineligible swimmer in the 9 yr. boys' medley, and the other for an empty lane in a 9 yr. boy' relay. The boys struggled valiantly, but are really very weak and we desperately need more born in 1988. In contrast, the 9 yr. girls swam well and showed promise.

The Club is also weak in the 11 yr. boys group which, with the exception of **Stuart Baker**, was covered by 10 yr. olds. Fortunately, we have strong 10 yr. swimmers, but we need to be on the look out for boys born in 1986.

# 5.1.97 Stourbridge Crystal Diddy Sprint Meet - Wolverhampton (25 m.)

This was, for several of our swimmers, their second visit to Wolverhampton during the weekend, nevertheless they produced some good results.

Jon Sheasby collected two of the glass goblets, awarded to the winners, for his mother, with a competition best swim in the F/S of 29.49 and a determined BR, 39.82. He was also 3rd in the FLY, 33.86 & in the 200 I.M., 2.42.08. Kate Hindson also placed 3rd in her I.M., 2.44.09. Tim Sheasby won a third goblet for mum in the BK, 39.54 and was 2nd in the F/S, 34.54, when a repeat of his heat time would have got him a second goblet. Emily & Sarah Paterson reached the BR, 49.38 and the BK 44.96 finals respectively, and Laura Heeley the FLY final, 31.09, but she must aim for faster swims in the finals. Four of our swimmers took advantage of the opportunity to compete over the longer distance in this popular Meet. **Jo Potter** took 1st in the 200 <u>BR</u>, 2.47.04, MQT & NQT. **Kate Hindson** swam a MQT in 4 events, including 400 <u>F/S</u>, 4.5.31. **Jon Sheasby** was 3rd in the 400 <u>F/S</u>, 4.55.22, MQT & NQT and he achieved another MQT in the 200 <u>F/S</u>, 2.20.53. **Lucy Lloyd-Roach** was 3rd in the 200 <u>FLY</u>, 2.39.00 and also swam a p.b. in the 200 <u>BK</u>, 2.39.38.

## 18/19th January '97 Wolverhampton Meet (25m.)

We had a very successful weekend at this Meet, which was not over crowded, and was very efficiently run. Of our 15 swimmers, 11 did at least one p.b. and two added to NQT's.

Gemma swam in 6 heats and 6 finals over the three days, with her best efforts being in the 200 FLY where she took silver, 2.26.80 and in the 100 FLY, 1.08.80 where she finished 3rd. Nicola had 9 swims, being well placed in her heats and improving on her heat times and placings in 2 B finals. We enjoyed meeting 'Our man in Geneva', Graig Norrey. He is recently back in the water, trying to regain his leg drive following a cartilage operation caused by jogging.

We only had 1 disqualification, for faulty arms in <u>FLY</u>, but we were very lucky not to have several more for fliers, for a stroke of <u>FLY</u> at the start of a <u>BR</u> length, and a stroke of <u>F/S</u> on another. Swimmers MUST listen to instructions and CONCENTRATE at the start.
