WELL DONE GEORGINA!

Competing in the Trials for the British Junior Team for the European Junior Championships in July, **Georgina** made sure of selection for the two Butterfly events. She achieved this by being the fastest junior in the 200 <u>FLY</u>, 2.18.85, incidentally finishing 3rd in the Senior race and yet another club record. She went on to win the Junior final, 1.04.69, and earlier swam a respectable 5.10.66 400 <u>I.M.</u>

Gemma Hindson swam a long-course <u>F/S</u> p.b. of 1.00.73 and a p.b. of 1.05.97 saw her take 6th place in the Junior FLY final.

SWIMMING COSTUMES - GIRLS

Some of our younger girls continue to swim in sacks. Costumes which are too big let water in on a dive, and act as a drag, slowing you down.

It does not matter how large a training costume is, or how many of them you wear, BUT for racing you need a tight costume. When it is dry you should just be able to pull the straps up to your ears. Any further and it is too big. Costumes stretch when they are wet, and ones which seem to fit when you try them on will wrinkle at the front and back unless they are small enough.

Most of our senior swimmers wear 28" or 30", even those who are tall. Average sized 10 and 11 year olds should be in 26" for racing then 28" until they are at least 5' 4" tall. If in doubt, ask SAM.
