RESULTS

4.10.97 Diddy Gala - Cheltenham - 33¹₃ m. C/Hill 201, Cheltenham 167, Evesham 157, Ledbury 103

This was a good win and it was useful experience for our 9 yr. group to compete in the 33¹₃ m. pool. With no 11 yr. boys present, our 10 yr. group, Andrew Vale, Tim Sheasby, Michael Bourne and Alastair McKenzie, had to cover two age groups and they coped very well. There were several good swims from the 'regulars', and our 9 yr. girls, Elizabeth Jones, Justine Clark, Zara Sadiq and Charlotte Parker look as if they will get many points for the club in future galas.

At the same time, at Worcester - 25m.

All the individual races were over 100m. so our 11/U swimmers found it hard going, but put in plenty of effort. I am grateful to them for their support at short notice with our 'regulars' being at Cheltenham. We accepted the gala a few days beforehand, following an appeal from Worcester. Well done Hannah Wear, Jemma Wyse, Sophie Heeley, Scarlet Allen-Horton, Gorav Wali, Stuart Tierney (several swims including 1.20 F/S), Nicholas Pilsbury and Richard Bates.

12.10.97 West Midland League - Mansfield - 25m.

C/Hill 201, Perry Beeches 'B' 186, Mansfield 182, Leic. Penguins 182, Luton 168, Avon Neptunes 133

With only 19 points separating the first 4 teams, this was a most exciting gala with the result still in doubt on our going into the final block of relays with an 8 points lead. We won 6 of the 10 races and it was encouraging that they included the 13 & 15 yr. boys events. We had many good swims, but none are mentioned here as it was a good allround team effort.

West Midland League - Derby - 33 1, m.

Calverton 215, Shrewsbury 199, Luton 'B' 173, Matlock 171, C/Hill 167, Solihull 'C' 124

At the start of the gala we were 4 swimmers short and had to forfeit 5 points in the third event because we only had three 11 yr. girls. The standard of the gala was surprisingly good and even our good Open swimmers, with the exception of the women's relay teams, found it difficult to win.

Our only individual winners were Hannah Loftus, F/S 1.09.66 and Katie Brooks, F/S 1.06.10. We won the two women's relays with great ease as Clare McLaughlin anchored the teams with two low 43 secs. legs. Most pleasing was our win in the 13 yr. Medley Relay, Ewan Martin 25.86, Rajiv Nijran, 28.10, Carl Reed 22.40 and a good finish from Nicholas Greene, 22.40. Fiona Loftus, BK 1.28.59 (plus good relay swims), and Gorav Wali, FLY 28.28, showed great determination to gain better points than we might have expected. With 6 more points we would have finished 3rd overall in this gala.

12.10.97 Haden Hill Meet - 25m.

This was 'P.B. day' for **Kate Hindson**, <u>F/S</u> 1.03.18, <u>BR</u> 1.21.74, <u>I.M.</u> 2.38.60, <u>FLY</u> 1.13.00 - all first places and <u>BK</u> 1.15.33 2nd. **Jon Sheasby** also won 4 of his 5 events with his best swim in the 50m. <u>BK</u> 36.76. **Ewan Martin** swam good times in the <u>I.M.</u>, 2.46.84, <u>FLY</u> 1.20.14. **Carl Reed** was 3rd in the <u>FLY</u> with 1.20.14 - now for a sub-80 secs. **Sally Jones** tackled a number of events, 2nd in the <u>F/S</u>, 1.04.87, 3rd in the <u>FLY</u> 1.14.92. **Michael Bourne**, now competing with more confidence, was 3rd in the <u>F/S</u> 35.06, and he swam good times in the <u>FLY</u>, 41.05 and <u>BK</u> 42.00.

18.10.97 Inter-Club Wellington - 25m.

C/Hill 220, Heartlands 173, Shrewsbury 140, Wellington 117, Lichfield 102

Last year our team was too weak at this gala - this time it was far too strong, as shown by the points total. Because of this, far too many of our swimmers wasted the opportunity to set good times, preferring to coast in to the finish. Some, however, did work: Ian Potter, BR 1.17.90 & 1.17.57 - with only one race between. Ewan Martin BK 37.86, FLY 35.62. Lorraine Pestridge, BR 1.30.56 and Leanne Sheasby, FLY 34.19, F/S 30.82.

25.10.97 Inter-Club, Haden Hill - 25m. Gloucester 158, Haden Hill 156, C/Hill 123, Avon Neptunes 71

Gloucester and Haden Hill had a real battle throughout this match with ourselves obviously destined for 3rd place. We were without our 5 representatives in the National Schools Championships, but the match produced the usual good swims.

F/S: Ian Potter 1.00.23 - so close to that sub-60 secs., 9 yr. Justine Clark, looking good, F/S 39.02. FLY: Michael Bourne 40.90, Elizabeth Jones 48.01. BR: Jemma Wyse 47.60, Ewan Martin 40.82, Louise Venables 43.04. BK: Lucy Lloyd-Roach 1.11.65, Chris Gregory 1.15.62 - he can do still better, Alastair McKenzie, BR 46.69 - but still giving the others a start - and not alone in that. Gutsy efforts by Mike Hoare who, despite that broken finger, had 3 good swims and it was a relief to witness David Haynes adopting a sensible breathing pattern.

The same weekend - National Schools - Crystal Palace - 50m.

Well done Gemma Hindson - Intermediate Champion on 100m. <u>FLY</u> 1.06.62. Georgina Lee - 2nd Senior Girls <u>FLY</u>; Nicola Sheasby, 4th Int. <u>F/S</u>; Jo Potter 8th Senior <u>BR</u>; Jon Baker a split of 26.48 <u>FLY</u>, Medley Team.

Also on the same weekend - National Masters - Sheffield, 25m.

Three medals for Trevor Clark, 2nd I.M. 1.07.01, 3rd 50 FLY 29.14, 3rd 50 BK 30.46. Bronze medals for our Mixed Medley Team: Trevor, Lynn Clark, Phil Baker and Kate Welch.

1st/2nd Nov. '97 Midland A.S.A. Short Course - Wolverhampton - 25m.

We had 11 swimmers at this event with Georgina Lee being the most successful, winning 4 senior titles and several junior ones, and setting Club records in 800 F/S, 8.58.43, and 400 I.M. 4.59.95. She was outside the medals in 4th place in the 400m. F/S but swam a 3rd CLUB Record of 4.23.87.

Jon Baker won the Men's 50m. <u>FLY</u> and Gemma Hindson took one Junior silver and three Junior bronze medals. The Women's <u>F/S</u> Team, Nicola Sheasby, Jo Minion, Gemma and Georgina won bronze medals.

On the same weekend - Coventry Junior Meet - 50m.

Our small group of swimmers did not do themselves any favours in this Meet. They will learn that you cannot get anything out of it if you do not put something in. Leanne Sheasby was the main exception, swimming 9 events and lifting her first open event trophies for 2nd places in 50 & 100 FLY and 200 I.M. Tim Sheasby won the 50 F/S, was 2nd in the 50 BK and 3rd in the 50 FLY, but, once again, his lack of discipline let him down. Jon Sheasby collected some medals, but manifested little interest.

Lorraine Pestridge and Alastair McKenzie showed real effort, finishing 3rd in their respective 50m. BR races. Our young swimmers tried hard with good times, but finishing out of the places. Emily and Sarah Paterson swam several P.B.'s, while Michael Bourne was close to Tim in their events.

Our very small team finished 7th out of the 32 participating clubs.

This was our second visit to Mansfield within 4 weeks, and we needed to finish in the first two places to qualify for the top gala in the final round. Derby took an early lead and steadily increased it throughout the gala. We were in second place, ahead of Solihull by one point after 13 races and by 3 points after 26 races. We then pulled ahead of them into a comfortable 2nd place. Once again, it was a good team effort, with our senior girls winning all their races. An unfit Darren Dyke, swam a useful F/S, 56.62 - good to have him and Ben Darbyshire strengthening our relays. Hannah Massey swam a determined F/S relay leg, 34.48, if only she would make that sort of effort all the time.

This was a busy weekend for the **Hindson** sisters, who in company with **Alex Knibbs**, won West Midlands Biathalon Championships on the Sunday.

Our women were 2nd in the Medley Relay and winners of the F/S race: Ruth Fraser 43.00, Hannah Loftus 44.10, Clare McLaughlin 42.83, Lucy Tubbs 41.63, Pam 42.72 and Hayley Bettinson 41.51-Well Done!

Ian Potter produced three excellent swims in the Open age group, <u>FLY</u> 1.05.68, <u>BR</u> 1.18.90, both 2nd and <u>F/S</u> 1.00.51. **Ruth Fraser** was 2nd in the <u>F/S</u> 1.07.56.

Jon Sheasby won an exciting F/S, 12 yr. boys, 59.45, was 3rd in the I.M. 2.34.67 and swam a good BR 1.21.08. Lucy Lloyd-Roach continued her BK improvement with 1.09.57 and Nicola Sheasby swam 1.01.69 F/S.

The standard of competition in this 8 lane modern pool was so good that it was almost frightening. We set out at 6.15 a.m. on what was to be a demanding and tiring weekend's swimming. **Kate Hindson**, as usual, our most active competitor, tackling 10 events. **Kate** obtained N.Q.T.'s on 800 F/S 9.25.35 - 2nd; 400 F/S , 400 I.M., and P.B.'s BK, FLY and 200 BR. **Sally Jones** swam well in her FLY races, but struggled on the F/S events. **Lucy Lloyd-Roach** swam a N.Q.T. on BK, 1.08.79 & 200 FLY, 2.31.84 with P.B.'s 0n 200 F/S, 2.13.25 & 200 BK. **Leanne Sheasby** enjoyed herself, she swam a good FLY and will enter many events next year. **Lyndsey Wyse** is still fading at the finish of her 100m. races but swam well to take 3rd place in the 50m.
