GEORGINA LEE: World Cup, Imperia, Italy (25m.) 100 FLY 1.02.40, 7th; Warks. Short Course Record. 200 FLY 2.13.80, 5th, Warks., and Midlands Short Course Records. Moving on to Paris, Georgina's times were not so fast, but she took 4th place in the 200 m. Her travels have now taken her to the England training camp in Australia.

**DAVID WOODHALL:** Swimming for Cambridge in the annual Varsity Match, David excelled himself with a 3 secs. improvement in the 100 <u>BR</u>, 1.08.38, 2nd, and a relay split of 1.07.30. These achievements gained him a 'FULL BLUE' colours award.

**GEMMA HINDSON**: Representing England in the Schools' International in Glasgow, placed 2nd in the <u>FLY</u> in a p.b. time, 1.05.85 (50 m.) and was a member of the winning <u>F/S</u> and Medley Relay Teams.

### 14th/16th Feb. High Wycombe Meet (50 m.)

Our small party of swimmers had a busy, exhausting and successful weekend and, I believe, were placed 3rd amongst the competing clubs. The Meet consisted of Open events, heats in the morning, finals in the evening, and Heat Declared Winner (HDW) age group events in the afternoons. **Gemma** won the age group <u>F/S</u>, <u>I.M.</u>, & <u>FLY</u>, and took silver in the Open 200 <u>FLY</u>, 2,26.51, and in the 200 <u>F/S</u> & 100 <u>FLY</u> and bronze in the 400 I.M.

Lucy Lloyd-Roach won the Open 200 BK in the very good time of 2.26.81 and had bronzes in the age group I.M., 2.33.91, FLY & BK.

**Kate Hindson** had silver in the 800 <u>F/S</u>, 9.28.01 and swam good times in the other Open events, 200 <u>F/S</u> 2.15. 99, 400 <u>I.M.</u> 5.26.59. She won the age group <u>FLY</u>, with silver in the I.M., 2.35.26.

Sally Jones undertook a heavy programme with a number of good swims including 50 FLY & 100 BK.

Kerry & Jemma Wyse both swam 1.39. + in the BR, while Alastair McKenzie had the misfortune to swallow water and was unable to complete his race. Such mishaps can and do happen - in the recent World Cup in Paris the English swimmer, in the lead halfway through the 200 m. swallowed water and had to stop. The 3 youngsters will have learned from this long course experience.

That was not all as there were money prizes for the Open events and vouchers for the age group races. Gemma returned home £80.00 richer plus £30.00 WHS vouchers; Lucy received £40.00 and £9.00 vouchers and Kate £20.00 and £15.00 vouchers.

This was our first gala for some time in a pool of this length, so it is good to be able to report that there were many p.b.'s. It was also a useful introduction to racing over longer distances for our new 9 yr. olds. They all managed very well, particularly Lydia Bell, BK 31.89, F/S 26.73 and Alyson Wicklen who recovered from a bout of stage fright to record 3 consistent F/S times, the best being 24.82.

Scarlett Allen-Horton continued to improve her <u>BK</u>, 57.22; Kerry Wyse beat 1 min. for <u>BR</u>, 59.26; Zara Sadiq & Sam Baker both produced good lengths of <u>BR</u>. Tim Sheasby behaved impeccably, and swimming sensibly he won 3 individual events, including <u>BK</u>, 52.45 & 12 yr. <u>F/S</u> 44.41. There were several over-eager take-overs when we were lucky not to be disqualified. Jemma Wyse AGAIN got away with 2 strokes underwater, and, finally could someone please explain to Alastair McKenzie (who is otherwise improving all the time) that the pool water is for swimming and not for drinking!

Kate Hindson and Lucy Lloyd-Roach swam a total of 7 events between them in this HDW distance Meet. Kate was first in the 400 <u>I.M.</u>, 5.29.92 and 2nd in the 200 <u>F/S</u>, 2.16.11. Lucy had two second places, 200 <u>FLY</u> 2.28.76 and 200 <u>BK</u> 2.30.72.

Unfortunately, the team was not at full strength for this important first round gala. The opposition was strong, and there was a good deal of 'mucking about' on the poolside, with the Referee having to speak to several team members about their behaviour. This lack of discipline and concentration shoed in the swimming, with a number of very poor performances - 2 boys in particular let themselves and the CLUB down by their obvious lack of effort.

This did not apply to the younger age groups who all tried very hard. However, the 9 yr. boys should note that they do not decide for themselves who swims which races. On the bright side, there were good <u>BR</u> wins by **Jemma Wyse**, 1.02.91., and **Alastair McKenzie** 1.02.12 (this time finishing the race without a drink) and several good <u>F/S</u> lengths from **Mark Barnsley** and **Stuart Tierney**. Other good swims: **Scarlett Allen-Horton**, <u>BK</u> 57.31 and **Justine Clark**, BK 28.91.

We had 3 disqualifications - 2 faulty <u>FLY</u> arms by 10 yr boys struggling valiantly, and one for <u>F/S</u> instead of <u>FLY</u> in a medley relay - the result of momentary mental block by the team management (mea culpa, F.G.T.).

This below average performance leaves us 4th from bottom of Div. I - much greater effort is needed if we are to avoid relegation.
