## 9/11. 4.98 Portsmouth Meet (25m.)

Jon Sheasby was the most successful of our 4 representatives, winning the <u>FLY</u>, 1.07.20, placing 2nd in the <u>F/S</u>, 59.42 & 2.09.36 and taking bronze in the 400 <u>F/S</u>, 4.37.17 and the 200 <u>BR</u>. Brother Tim was 3rd in the <u>BK</u> and <u>BR</u>, while sister Leanne swam some good times. Lyndsey Wyse had good swims on <u>BR</u>, <u>FLY</u> & 50 <u>F/S</u>.

#### Luxembourg Junior Meet (50m.)

On the same weekend Lucy Lloyd-Roach, Kate Hindson and I travelled with the West of England Team to spend a demanding 2 days at this well-established Meet, which was attended by swimmers from all over Europe. Heats were combined, based on entry times, and finals decided in age groups. Kate swam 9 times, her best swims being in the 200 FLY 5th and the 400 F/S, 6th. Lucy swam 12 times, her efforts being in the 200 FLY where she took the silver medal, 2.28.67 and the 100 FLY 4th, 1.08.81. She was 7th in the 200 I.M. and 6th in the 200 BK.

The Meet was extremely busy with lengthy sessions and a crowded bathside (18 heats of male 200 <u>F/S</u>, 13 of 400 <u>F/S</u>). We had to be up by 6.30 a.m. and travel to and from the pool on the service bus. It was valuable experience for the girls, and, despite previous warnings, there was no problem in feeding them. Some of the more noteworthy winning times: 13 yr Girls, <u>FLY</u> 1.03.74, 200 <u>BR</u> 2.46.25, 400 <u>F/S</u> 4.28.07, 100 <u>F/S</u> 59.35 and 200 <u>F/S</u> 2.07.98.

# 25.4.98 Avon Neptunes Meet (331 m.)

A sizeable contingent entered this Meet which included 10 yr. races giving our supporters plenty to watch. I am certain that several of our younger swimmers should have entered. Best performances:

Hannah Loftus, BK 1.17.52; Chris Gregory 1.15.52; Pam Schofield FLY 1.13.11.

# The following day - Oswestry Meet - Wolverhampton (25m.)

Lucy Lloyd-Roach continued her improvement, winning the <u>FLY</u> in a National Q.T., 1.06.67. She was also 1st in the <u>BK</u> and took silver in the <u>F/S</u>, 1.01.71 and the <u>I.M.</u>, 2.32.08. Swimming in the 13/14 group, **Jon Sheasby's** improved attitude in training resulted in his winning the 200 <u>F/S</u>, 2.07.88, N.Q.T., placing 2nd in the <u>F/S</u>, 59.41 N.Q.T., 3rd in the <u>I.M.</u> and completing a respectable <u>BK</u>, 1.11.52.

Kate Hindson won the award for the top Female, winning the 200 F/S, 2.15.27, the I.M. and the BR, 1.21.55. Tim Sheasby gained a Midland Q.T. in 5 events. Gemma Hindson won her one event, the 200 I.M. in a good 2.26.47. Sally Jones and Leanne Sheasby qualified for the finals, but must then improve on their heat times. Carl Reed swam a good FLY, but he too must produce a faster final. Laura Heeley lowered her BR time to 1.40.27, if she can discipline her strokes she will improve in several events.

# 2/4 May 1998 - Midland Long Course Championships - Coventry

Georgina Lee took 3 gold medals. 100/200 FLY and 400 LM. 5.00.45. She placed 2nd in the 400 F/S and 3rd in the 200 & 800, 9.02.91. Gemma Hindson was 2nd in the 50 FLY and 3rd in the 100, 1.06.66, & 200. Lucy Lloyd-Roach swam well to finish 4th in the FLY events with a p.b. of 1.07.84 in the 100m. Jon Baker was our other medallist, 2nd in the 50 FLY after scraping into the final in 8th place. New member Hayden Wakeling finished 6th in the F/S, showing his sprint ability over 80m., but needing to improve his stamina to finish better. Our Women's F/S Team finished 4th in a CLUB RECORD, 4.05.96, and our Medley Team also was 4th.

Special compliments to 10 yr. Matthew Green who cheerfully agreed to swim a length of <u>FLY</u> at very short notice and for the first time, in a long pool, thereby gaining a valuable extra point.

G.B. Masters - Glasgow

Trevor went on to compete in the G.B. Masters and won 3 silver medals, 50/100 FLY 29.57/1.05.78, 50 BK and a bronze.

Meanwhile - Birmingham Meet - Stechford (25m.)

We had several noteworthy efforts in this well organised local event. Lucy Lloyd-Roach's swims, 1st 200/100 FLY (1.06.28), 2nd I.M. 2.29.68, 2nd 100/200 BK 1.08.50/2.27.41 gained her the prize for her age group as did Tim Sheasby's swims. He worked hard to win 4 of his 5 events, only losing out on the FLY on the last 25m. His best swim was the F/S, 1.07.51. Georgina Lee emerged from her exam revision to swim an outstanding 400 F/S, 4.16.97 CLUB RECORD, as was her winning time in the 800 F/S, 8.48.35.

Other 'revisers': Nicola Sheasby, F/S 1.01.27, 3rd in a race won by Gemma Hindson, 59.53, who also won the 400 LM., 5.09.44, was 2nd to Georgina with a p.b. of 2.21.58 in the 200 FLY and 2nd in the 200 F/S. Lyndsey Wyse swam a FLY p.b. of 1.08.92 with sister Jemma doing a Midland Q.T. of 1.34.12 BR. Our other female finalists were Laura Heeley, FLY 1.29.58, Sally Jones, FLY, Kate Hindson, 400 F/S 3rd. Rachel McLaughlin and Leanne Sheasby swam best times. Jon Sheasby won the FLY, 1.06.35 and the 200 LM., 2.28.71 and was 2nd in the F/S, 58.29 and 2.07.87. Ben Howell qualified 6th in the F/S and swam a good final to take bronze, 58.03. David Haynes made the BK final and Andrew Weedall, BR 1.23.86 and Michael Bourne, FLY 1.26.96 had good swims.

### 16.5.98 Midland Age Group Teams

In order to qualify for the National Age Group Relays teams have to finish 1st or 2nd in the District Championships, and with 3 of last year's national silver medal winning team, 15/16 yr girls again still in the age group, we had high hopes of success. These were realised when Lyndsey Wyse, Nicola Sheasby, Lucy Lloyd-Roach and Gemma Hindson placed 2nd in the Medley Relay and did even better in the F/S, holding off a strong challenge from Nova to win in 1.54.47. The 17/18 girls Pam Schofield, Katie Brooks, Claire McLaughlin and Georgina Lee took silver medals in their F/S race, 1.57.42 and our 13/14 girls did well to place 5th and 7th in their finals.

We could only manage one team of boys and our 13/14 Team produced respectable swims to finish 17th and 18th out of 30 in their races.

## The following day Midland Age Group 50m. Sprints

Tim Sheasby, at last looking the complete Camp Hill swimmer in a club cap, won the F/S 31.11 and was 3rd in the FLY, brother John was 3rd in his F/S, Ben Howell qualified for 2 finals and Jon Baker won the FLY, 26.82. Warren Jones AT LAST reduced his FLY breathing to every 3 strokes BUT did not deprive himself of several glances across - however, his 3rd place, 29.38 was a good swim. Lucy Lloyd-Roach had good silvers in the BK & FLY, 31.40. Leanne Sheasby and Sally Jones finished 4th and 5th respectively in the FLY final. I hope they continue to push each other to still faster times.

## 25.5.98 Sheffield Grand Prix (50m.) Junior Meet (50m.)

We had some good long course swims at Sheffield, with **Jon Sheasby** taking 3 gold, <u>F/S</u> 1.00.44, <u>FLY</u> 1.07.96, <u>I.M.</u> 2.29.28. Sister **Leanne** won her first gold at an Open Meet, <u>F/S</u> 1.04.04 and continues to improve her <u>FLY</u>, 1.12.65. Brother **Tim** took bronze in the <u>BK</u>, 1.22.25 (Ht. 1.20.94), still needing to improve in finals. **Michael Bourne** swam a useful <u>F/S</u> 1.15.61 and **Laura Heeley**, <u>BR</u> 1.41.92, <u>FLY</u> 1.31.64.

## 29/31st May 1998 Sheffield Grand Prix

Lucy Lloyd-Roach and Gemma Hindson competed on one day and although not reaching finals, had the satisfaction of winning their respective heats of 200 BK & 200 F/S. Georgina Lee, having recovered from the disappointment of having to turn down trips to Vancouver and Athens (priority of school work) placed 2nd in the 200 FLY and 4th in the 100, with an overseas swimmer taking 3rd. This was the last of the British Grand Prix series and Georgina went home richer by £350.00.

Our results were somewhat disappointing, although it is encouraging to be able to mention 3 boys. **Ewan Martin**, <u>I.M.</u> 2.35.58, <u>FLY</u> 1.13.64; **James Sumner**, improving steadily, <u>F/S</u> 1.02.46 & 2.17.90, **Michael Bourne**, showing his preference for Short Course, <u>FLY</u> 1.27.75.

Also on the same weekend - Braunstone Meet - St. Margarets (25m.)

A small select group, namely Laura, Sophie, Charlotte Heeley, Andrew Vale,

Edward & Hannah Freeman entered and all had a successful day. Edward,

Andrew, Hannah and Sophie achieved P.B.'s in all their races, even though Edward had to be dragged from the bar where he was watching the Grand Prix, for his BR race. Charlotte made her first ever final, finishing 6th in the 13 yr. BR, 43.46, but it was Laura who had the best day of all achieving Midland Q.T.'s (although as it was not a designated Meet they could not count) in 50 FLY and finishing joint first with her friend from Luton in the final, 37.17. She also swam F/S 34.91 and BR, 2nd 42.51.

From a poor and shaky start, each round of the League has seen some improvement, with this gala being our best performance, in terms both of swimming and behaviour. The team was almost at full strength and everyone swam with determination thereby producing encouraging times.

The four 9 yr. girls all recorded F/S p.b.'s with the star being Allyson Wicklen 23.67 & 23.86. Three of the 9 yr. boys followed suit. Other good F/S swims came from Hannah Massey 47.44 and Alistair MacKenzie 49.12. Charlotte Parker and Lydia Bell both knocked 1 sec. off one length BK to go 28.04 and 30.26 respectively. Our butterfly swimmers were in fine form: Elizabeth Jones 25.84; Justine Clark 24.70; Matthew Green 33.43 (a 6 sec. improvement, he was then very unlucky to be disqualified in the second race); Laura Heeley 23.70 and 54.69 (3 sec. better) and Kerry Wyse 49.87 (2.5 sec. better).
