RESULTS

3.10.98 Diddy Gala - Cheltenham (331, m.)

Haden Hill 280, C/Hill 173, Cheltenham 162, Lydney 95, Cheltenham B 80

This gala got off to a bad start while a starting block socket was, with great difficulty, unblocked. There were several reprimands of swimmers for climbing into the spectator gallery (apparently there had recently been an accident) and for yo-yos on the poolside (one had disintegrated at a recent gala). Furthermore, the very slow processing of the results also helped to make it a somewhat drawn-out occasion. Despite that, it provided an opportunity to study the progress of our swimmers and to bring the ranking lists up to date.

4.10.98 Leicester Penguins Meet (St. Margarets 25m.)

The 11 yr. group raced over 50m. with several good results: Laura Heeley, BR 41.63, FLY 36.18 - 1st; sister Sophie, BK 44.68; Tim Sheasby was highly placed in all his events with a BR p.b. of 40.43. Brother Jon was comfortably successful in F/S & FLY, and is moving towards becoming an all-round swimmer with BR, 1.18.37 and BK 1.12.81. Ewan Martin, BK 1.16.04, BR 1.21.70, continues to improve, and we had some good FLY performances: Ian Potter 1.02.68; Nicola Sheasby 1.11.42, Kerry Wyse 1.21.52 - but better pacing could bring her time down another 3 secs.

10.10.98 West Midland League - Rugby (25m.)

C/Hill 240, Perry Beeches B 190, Rugby 183, Northgate 165, Bilston 143, Redditch 125

This was a solid performance with many good swims. Georgina Lee showed that her 3 weeks Lay-off had done no harm with a 1.03.55 FLY, and Ben Howell swam a good BR, 1.14.53. Lucy Lloyd-Roach, FLY 1.07.35; Kate Hindson, BR 1.21.72. Robert Delves showed that he has not forgotten how to sprint with two good relay splits, and Hayden Wakeling, in his first league swim for Camp Hill, produced an exciting 24.77 relay split, - thanks also to David Woodhall for returning from Cambridge to swim for the Club.

Stratford (3313 m.)

This was a good result for our B Team at this gala from which Bicester defaulted, and it is to be hoped that we can present a similar team for the next 2 rounds of the League. The following swims were noteworthy:

This Meet, with 50m. races and an I.M., provided a good chance for 24 of our juniors to review their progress on the 4 strokes, thereby up-dating our ranking lists. Improved times too from Kelly Thornton, BR 46.14, and Tessa Loftus, BK 43.63.

17.10.98 Inter-Counties - Sheffield (25m.)

The following swam in the County Team: Georgina Lee, <u>FLY</u> 1.03.08 1st; Ian Potter, <u>FLY</u> 1.03.09; Lucy Lloyd-Roach, <u>FLY</u> 1.05.55 3rd County Junior Short Course Record; Jon Sheasby, 26.94. Ewan Martin, in the Worcs. Team, lowered his <u>FLY</u> to 1.11.80 - now for his first sub 70 secs.

On the same day, Inter-Club, Leicester (25m.)

This must have been the shortest gala of the year, with the poolside being empty for some time before the recorders completed their task.

We had 4 representatives at this unusual venue for the National Schools' Championships. Gemma Hindson, Nicola Sheasby, Lucy Lloyd-Roach and Jon Sheasby, who was our most successful with a silver medal in the <u>FLY</u>. Bad weather conditions delayed their return by a day, but good planning got them away on the first (and last) boat the following morning.

24.10.98 Inter-Club Haden Hill (25m.)

Haden Hill 122, C/Hill 93, Bilston 87

Not surprisingly, on this weekend of terrible weather, Llanelli withdrew from the gala. However, it proved to be very useful for us, as we were able to have additional swimmers in the spare lanes; Mark Barnsley, Zara Sadiq, Mat. Green, Sam Baker, Alyson Wicklen, Amy Few and Laura Rogers. Ian Potter swam all the Open events with F/S 57.67 & FLY 1.02.52, sister Jo swam a good BR, 1.18.73. Rachel McLaughlin produced a 2 secs. F/S p.b. 1.07.32, and to show that it was not a one-off, a 1.07.92 eight races later. Other good swims: Kerry Wyse, BR 39.77; Sam Baker, F/S 38.41 and Mat. Green 38.65; Kate Hindson, BR 1.20.88; Ben Howell, F/S 58.47; Jemma Wyse, BR 1.30.57.

Thanks to Georgina Lee for turning out despite a painful neck, and to Clark Hands who appeared, but was obviously not well enough to race. Well done, too, our two first-time 50m. FLY swimmers.

23rd/25th Oct. '98 National Masters, Sheffield (25m.)

This must have been our smallest team ever for this event - can we increase our participation next year? Trevor Clark placed 3rd in the 100 FLY and 2nd in the 400 F/S, while Phil Baker was 4th in the FLY. Kate Chase tackled several events, including 200 BR, and she and Lynn Clark joined the two men to finish 9th in their relays. On reading the results, one could get a little reflected glory from the swims of ex-members Simon Garside, Jo Minion, Andy Small, Chris Tainty, and our police reps Claire Duffy and Norman Stephens.

31st Oct./1st Nov. '98 Midland Short Course - Wolverhampton

Camp Hill's girls were in sparkling form at this event. Georgina Lee, in her first important competition since returning from the Commonwealth Games, collected Gold in the 100/200 FLY, 400 LM., 400/800 F/S; she took Silver in another 3 events and a Bronze. Gemma Hindson was Junior Champion on 50/100/200 FLY and 100 LM. She also won 2 Junior Silvers, 1 Senior Silver, and 3 Senior Bronzes. Lucy Lloyd-

Roach took Bronze in the Junior 200 FLY, and Nicola Sheasby won Gold in the Junior 50 F/S and Bronze in the Senior 100 F/S.

Most pleasing to our supporters, however, was the success of the 4 girls in the relay events. We beat Nottinghamshire based Nova Centurion by .56 of a sec. in the 4 x 100 F/S and took 2nd place to them by .17 of a sec. in the Medley Relay. Both times were well inside Club Records, with the F/S Team beating 4 mins (3.59.77) an average of 59+. Hayden Wakeling placed 3rd in the men's F/S with 54.35 only 3 hundredths behind the winner.

The same weekend - Coventry Meet 10-14 yrs. (50m.)

Our 15 reps. had some good swims and finished 4th in the club points table. Sally Jones, tackling 10 events on the day, took the 'Top Girl Award' and Jon Sheasby was winner of the 13 yr. boys. Good swims:

The late arrival of a carload of our swimmers cost us approximately 13 points, leaving us in 4th place at the halfway stage of the gala. Many good efforts took us gradually into 1st place by event 37, and it looked as if everything was under control with some good relay results anticipated. Unfortunately, the disqualification of a victorious team cost us 6 points and with the Open Relays to go we were 2nd by 12 point. 1st and 2nd places saw us home by 12 point - despite all the setbacks we had managed it! Tamworth (25m.)

Having won our first round gala, we only needed to finish 1st or 2nd to qualify for the final. We could have had 8 more points if the 4th boy had not failed to arrive for the two 11 yr. relays. We would have been 6 points better than Evesham if our 15/U girls relay had not had a needless flyer. We would have beaten Evesham if the referee had not misunderstood the FLY law and disqualified Carl Reed (an easy winner) and Sophie Mayor, who was a clear second. Let us be sure that we do not have any such problems in the last round.

We had more wins than any other club: Lyndsey Wyse, I.M. 1.12.41, BR 1.24.55; Sally Jones, FLY 1.12.79, F/S 1.06.48; Pam Schofield, FLY 1.15.25; Elie Martin, a very rewarding BK 1.16.94; Jemma Wyse, BR 42.78, and for the boys Carl Reed,

BK 1.18.30; Chris Gregory, BR 1.23.11. The Open Ladies easily won their relays, as did the 15/U girls medley and the 11/U girls F/S teams. N.S.

This high level Meet, with Open Heats a.m., Age Group races p.m. and finals for both in the evening, attracted many of the best swimmers in the Country.

Georgina Lee's 2nd place in the 200 FLY earned her selection for the G.B. Team for the European Short Course Championships: she swam in 3 other finals, placing 3rd in the 100 FLY. Gemma Hindson had good FLY swims, 200 2.22.90 - 6th, 100 1.05.84 - 7th. We also had some success at the age group level: Jon Sheasby, 200 I.M. 2nd 2.25.04, FLY 3rd, and a p.b. of 2.05.86 200 F/S. Sister Nicola had 2 p.b.'s: 200 F/S 2.12.16, I.M. 2.34.94 and Lucy Lloyd-Roach placed 3rd in the FLY.

21.11.98 Oakengates Junior Trophy Gala - Wellington (25m.)

This was one of the longest, hottest and least well organised galas that most of us can remember. Despite starting 30 mins. earlier than usual and consisting of only 25m. and 50m. races, it managed to last 314 hours, finishing just before 8.45 p.m.

However, from the point of view team selection for next season's junior team it was useful and interesting. Several regulars were surprised to find themselves swimming events other than their usual ones, and two boys, Alex Evans and Peter Knight were making their first appearance for the Club.

Best swims all came from 9 yr. olds: Alex, BK 21.97; Aaron Sumner, FLY 23.39; Kirsty Rostil, BR 24.04. The team was not at full strength and this was an encouraging result.
