RESULTS

10.1.99 Stourbridge Crystal Meet

This was to be the first of three consecutive weekends at Wolverhampton for some of us. We had 20 representatives, and, although we managed few first places, we did have a number of P.B.'s. Our finalists were: Justine Clark, F/S 3rd, 33.39, FLY 5th 39.48; BK 4th Tim Sheasby, F/S 1st, FLY 3rd; Michael Bourne FLY 4th; Emily Paterson BR 4th; Alastair McKenzie BR 5th; Kerry Wyse BR 4th 39.78; Laura Heeley BR 6th; Sarah Paterson BK. Good swims also from Alyson Wicklen, Kate Parton, Kirsty Rostill, Aaron Sumner, Alex Evans and Peter Knight.

16/17th Jan. Wolverhampton Meet (second week!)

We won a fair number of medals and had a good crop of best times. **Ewan Martin** achieved Midland Qualifying Times on <u>I.M.</u>, 2.31.47 and 5,22.15; **Ian Potter** on <u>I.M.</u> 2.22.31 and <u>FLY</u> and he swam a very good 200 <u>F/S</u> 2.03.54. **Carl Reed** had 3 best times, and **Michael Bourne** won medals on 100/200 <u>FLY</u> and 200 <u>F/S</u>. How nice to be noting success by our boys for a change. **Jo Potter** showed that she can still race a

good 200 <u>BR</u>, 2.45.45; **Lucy Lloyd-Roach** swam a National Time on <u>BK</u>, 2.25.60 and a good <u>F/S</u> 1.02.41. **Georgina Lee** had 4 wins, including <u>F/S</u> 59.36, while **Gemma Hindson** took the 100/200 <u>FLY</u>. Other best times from **Hannah Wear**, <u>BR</u> 1.37.37; **Laura Heeley**, <u>FLY</u> 1.25.71 and **Kerry Wyse** 1.16.45.

23rd/24th Jan. 99 Brierley Hill Meet (third week!)

There was a good turn-out for this Meet with the following rewarding swims:

Warren Jones F/S 26.77 (2nd) & 59.55, BR 1.16.57. Ewan Martin BR 1.18.65, BK 1.12.91. Lyndsey Wyse, FLY 1.12.40; sister Kerry, F/S 31.87. Michael Bourne, BK 1.22.12; James Sumner FLY 1.08.72; Carl Reed, FLY 1.13.86 in his heat. This was followed by his kicking a ball about for an hour before his final when he swam 4 secs. slower - I wonder why? Two good wins for Jon Sheasby 100/200 F/S.

Also on 24th - County Match - Milton Keynes

We had 4 representatives: Georgina Lee, Lucy Lloyd-Roach, Kate Hindson and Ruth Fraser, with Lucy and Georgina winning their events and with Warwickshire winning the match.

Sjaelland Meet - Copenhagen (50m.)

Gemma Hindson was a member of the Midland District Team, and she swam several races, reaching 3 finals, with her best effort in the 200 <u>FLY</u> where she was 4th in a best time of 2.23.62. **Kate Hindson** representing Camp Hill also swam a best 200 <u>FLY</u> time in the Junior Final, 2.35.39 (5th). **Lucy Lloyd-Roach** took the silver medal in that race, 2.25.08 and was 4th in the 100 <u>FLY</u>, 1.06.47.

6.2.99 Inter-Club - Stechford (25m.)

Our Open & 15/U groups had things all their own way in this well run trophy gala (the starter could not be blamed for the malfunctioning of the Solihull loaned gun). Our younger groups had to work to gain points, but there were encouraging swims from Peter Knight, Sam Baker, Charlotte Parker and Matthew Green who all finished their races strongly. Jemma Wyse, BR 1.29.87, dipped below 90 secs. for the first time - she can further improve with a faster first 50. Kate Hindson had a pleasing F/S, 1.02.80, and Jon Sheasby brought his BR down to 1.15.24. James Sumner is developing into a good all rounder with BK, 1.10.41 & FLY 1.08.13. Kerry Wyse swam a much better F/S in the relay, 30.80, while Ian Potter again produced a good 100 FLY and can improve again when his approach to the wall is on the stroke.

13.2.99 Worcester Challenge Trophy - Halesowen 362 yds.

Haden Hill 237, Worcester A 167, C/Hill 156, Witney 146, Bromsgrove 116, Worcester B 50

This gala followed the standard Junior (Diddy) League programme and produced some exceedingly good swims.

Most notable were the 9/U girls, Hope Weaver, Sarah Thornton, Jodie Leresche and Emily Link, who won both their relays in fine style.

Individual high performances included Justine Clark, FLY 58.11 and F/S 48.63; Andrew Vale (who seems to have grown several inches over Christmas, and is also showing encouraging signs of maturity) F/S 46.53 (1st); Clark Hands, FLY 28.80 (the best of his many good swims - he will have slept well on Saturday night). Sam Baker, BR 28.71 and 1.04.63 (despite having carried his goggles most of the way). Sarah Thornton, BR 32.45 (but she must watch her take-overs), sister Kelly, BR 27.98, having finally learnt to keep her head still while swimming, also 2 much improved F/S lengths.

On the minus side, we were lucky to get away with 3 obvious flyers. It is NO GOOD winning a race if you (or worse still, your team) are disqualified because you went too soon.

13th/15th Feb. '99 High Wycombe Meet (50m.) 'She's in the Money'

Gemma Hindson returned from this Meet £120 richer, the reward for 3 wins (one of them a well paced 400 <u>I.M.</u>), 1 second and 2 third places. Lucy Lloyd-Roach also showed a profit with £40 for winning the 200 <u>FLY</u>, 2.25.40 and £10 for 3rd place in the 100 <u>BK</u>. Nicola Sheasby overcame her customary diffidence with a number of determined swims, <u>F/S</u> 2nd 1.01.37 (£20) and 26.27 3rd (£10) - also <u>FLY</u> 1.10.34 - will she get that sub 70 secs. before Leanne?

Kate Hindson swam a good FLY 1.11.57, for 3rd in the 15/16 Group.

Jon Sheasby won the F/S in a best time, 57.54 and was 2nd in the I.M. 2.26.41. He also swam 2.06. + twice in the Men's 200 F/S. Ewan Martin had good swims in FLY and I.M. 2.33.85, and Ben Howell, despite interrupting his weekend by returning for a soccer match, swam well including F/S 57.85, missing 3rd by .02 and 2nd by .05. We finished a creditable 3rd in the overall points total. Our 5 young age groupers who competed will have gained valuable long course experience in the approach to the County Championships at Coventry.

20th/21st Feb. '99 Leeds Grand Prix

Georgina Lee was a convincing winner of the 100 and 200 FLY and returned home with £80 prize money. In the Age Group events Jon Sheasby was 2nd in the 100/200 F/S, and he won the FLY in a P.B. of 1.04.12. Brother Tim was 3rd in the BK, and he and Michael Bourne had good swims in the FLY. Ewan Martin, nursing a bad arm, still swam well, his best effort being in the BR, 1.20.81.
