This match, hosted by Halesowen followed the Junior League format, and winning it was gratifying as most of our regular 12 year olds were swimming elsewhere and several other team members were unavailable.

Hannah Freeman was in good form, <u>BK</u> 27.72 & 58.60. as was Alyson Wicklen, <u>F/S</u> 22.89. The 9 yr. girls won both their relays, and it was encouraging to see the continued improvement of the 9 yr. boys.

The team was generally well behaved, though it is unhelpful to have swimmers continually pestering for their events to be swapped round. There were no disqualifications.

As this was an inter-club gala (not an open competition or a league) the programme was allowed to include individual events for 9 yr. olds. They swam one length races as did the 10 yrs. with the 11's and 12's racing 2 lengths.

We had 18 first places, including 8 of the final 9 F/S relays. There were disqualifications, two for blatant flyers, and one unlucky one for arms not quite clearing the water at the end of 2 lengths butterfly. There were very many good swims of which these were the best:

10.4.99 Round I Junior League - Walsall (3623 yds.)

This was it - we were at Walsall for the first round of the league. The date meant that we were without some swimmers, but this probably applied equally to all of the teams. We were also without our leader, Anne Lee, but had, as usual, prepared our campaign meticulously and we were ready for the fray. It is so important to get a good result in round I, but after 12 events we were in 4th place. Were we going to have another season struggling to avoid relegation? The troops rallied, however, and by event 25 we were well behind Solihull, but 6 points clear of Walsall and Nuneaton and succeeded in holding our position for the rest of the gala. Team behaviour was good although the 'Can I get changed? syndrome' immediately after the questioner's race was as irritating

as ever. Everyone tried hard, with our best swims coming from Laura Heeley, FLY 50.91 and Sam Baker, BR 1.02.63.

17.4.99 Hardwick Trophy Gala - Bridgnorth (25 m.)

This was the first time for several years that we had competed in this 4 lane deck-level pool. The parents found the spectators' gallery cramped and lacking in seats, but that did not dampen their enthusiastic support for what proved to be a winning team. The 9 yr. girls maintained their success story with maximum points from individual and relay events. The 9 yr. boys were not to be outdone, and also won all their races. It was encouraging to see young <u>FLY</u> swimmers **Jodie Leresche** and **Daniel Greaves** leaving the opposition trailing.

Other good swims included Theodora Manassier, <u>FLY</u> 42.20 and Melita Bown, <u>F/S</u> 41.36. Sam Baker took 3 secs. off his 50m. <u>BR</u> to record 44.92 and Michael Christie did even better, knocking 4 secs. off, 53.58.

Leeds Masters

Trevor made his annual visit to the Leeds Masters, returning with 2 Golds including 200 FLY, 2.45.74, one Silver, F/S 1.02.14, and a Bronze.

1st/2nd May '99 Midlands Long Course - Coventry

We had quite a mixed bag of results over the two days. Jon Baker won the 50 FLY after having to qualify for the final from the first heat (late card posting). Gemma Hindson swam a good 200 F/S 2.10.65 and placed 3rd and 4th respectively in the 100, 1.05.91, and the 200 FLY, 2.24.28. Hayden Wakeling actually swam 5 times, including F/S 56.48. It's difficult to comprehend how he refuses to race 50's although he is usually leading at that stage of 100 m. races. Georgina Lee was only present for two sessions. Tackling a heavy programme, she won the two FLY events and was 2nd and 3rd in hard working 800 and 400 F/S races in addition to the relay swims. Yet again our Women's team, Lucy Lloyd-Roach, Nicola Sheasby, Gemma and Georgina, sent us home happy with 2nd place in the F/S, 4.05.06 and 3rd in the Medley, 4.30.33 (long course best) a mere 0.36 secs. behind the winners. Thanks also to Jo Potter and Leanne Sheasby for turning out to provide cover for the relay heats.

Junior League - Round II - 8.5.99 Tudor Grange (33¹₃ m.) Solihull 202, C/Hill 156, Phoenix Youth 145, Cheadle 142, Rugby 129, Perry Beeches B 121

This was another good result for our Junior team, and should mean that we are well placed in the league table going into Round III. This will be swum on June 19th, so please make sure you are available for selection.

10 yr. olds Alyson Wicklen and Kofi Osei got us off to a good start, both coming second with p.b.'s for 1 length F/S. Michael Christie followed that with a 2 sec. p.b. for the BR, 31.86. Michael Bourne swam an excellent 2 length BK, coming first in 52.03, but found the going understandably harder in the FLY shortly after. Timothy Sheasby, trying hard and behaving well, won the BR, 57.47, came 2nd in the F/S and swam several good anchor legs, the best being 18.91. The 11 yr. boys worked hard, deputising for 12s in some races. Sam Baker managed a legal 2 length FLY after Peter Knight was disqualified for faulty FLY arms in the medley relay. Some stroke judges appear not to know the law very well. Matthew Green swam a good 2 length BK and managed a creditable 2 length F/S with his goggles full of water. Better turns would have improved both times. The 9 yr. girls continued their winning ways, with Hope Weaver, F/S 23.01, and Natalie Griffiths 24.90, both p.b.'s. Richard Baker's BR, 33.52, was a 2 sec. improvement.
