Ewan Martin collected the 'Swimmer of the Meet' award at the end of a day which saw him competing in 8 events. His best swims were: FLY 1.07.08, 200 F/S 2.12.53, 200 BR 2.44.88. David Haynes set a FLY p.b. of 1.04.94 and Andrew Weedall improved his time to 1.14.02.

29/31 May '99 City of Birmingham Meet - Stechford (25m.)

The Meet was over three days, Most of our successes came from our older competitors although 11 yr. Justine Clark qualified for 2 finals and Michael Bourne swam a F/S p.b. of 1.09.65. Andrew Weedall's greater application in training brought him 3 p.b.'s. Kate Hindson came to life in the final sessions with bronzes in the 100/200 FLY 1.11.40/2.33.35 and a p.b. in the 200 BR, 2.53.19. Ian Potter won the 200 FLY, 2.16.50 and he was 3rd in the 100, 1.02.54. Ben Howell reached 3 finals with bronze in the BR, 1.12.50. Lyndsey Wyse was in good form, BK 1.12.50, FLY 1.09.51, F/S 1.02.69.

Lucy Lloyd-Roach's 2nd placed time in the 200 FLY 2.22.42, was a County Junior Record and her 2nd place in the 200 BK was a Club Senior/Junior Record.

Gemma Hindson swam a comprehensive range of events, with her 6 Golds earning her the female open 'Swimmer of the Meet' award. Her times included FLY p.b. 1.04.95, 400 I.M. 5.04.50, 200 F/S 2.07.13.

## 19.6.99 Junior League - Round 3 Walsall (3623 vds)

At first sight this was a disappointing result and an end to our hopes of making the area final. We were outclassed by bigger clubs with wider catchment areas, 3 of whom

were 'home bankers' for the final. However, there were 26 p.b.'s and extremely encouraging swims, some of them easy to overlook. Sarah Paterson's F/S, 46.60, makes her the fastest 12/U girl in the club, although she finished last. Sister Emily also recorded a p.b. BR, 56.56 without winning her race. Other p.b.'s included Sam Baker, BR 63.31 (3rd); Clark Hands, F/S 53.23; Kirsty Rostill, BR 31.74; Alex Evans, BR 32.67, BK 29.47.

Tim Sheasby worked hard to swim to his time in the BR (4th) and a p.b. in the FLY, 49.01 (2nd). He had rushed back from Sheffield where his school had finished 4th in both relays in the National Schools Championships, beating Millfield twice as a bonus. Our entire 11 yr. girls' team also returned at speed from Sheffield where each had been swimming for her school.

Justine Clark coped well with the extra pressure, producing a p.b. BK, 54.63 (3rd) and a solid swim to take 3rd also in the FLY. Gemma Ramsden swam a BR p.b., 1.04.10 (4th) and Charlotte Parker, just back in the water after a broken shoulder was 4th in the F/S less than a second below her best time. Three of our 9 yr. olds were in great form: Natalie Griffiths, BK 29.35; Emily Link, F/S 23.75 and Lewis Hands, BK 31.95, F/S 26.33. 10 yr. olds Lydia Bell, Kate Parton and Thomas Mills also recorded p.b.'s. It was disappointing to see a number of poor finishes, especially as we had just held 3 extra starts, turns and finishes sessions. Several people finished with their noses against the wall, instead of reaching for it with a straight arm, thus swimming almost a metre further than necessary. Overall, the season has seen an improvement in our Junior team, both in terms of performance and involvement and commitment by swimmers and parents. We finish solidly placed towards the top of Division 1. Let's hope that next year will see us make that final.

We had some good results on the first weekend of the Championships. Georgina Lee took 1st place in the 17/19 yr. girls 100/400 F/S and was 2nd in the 200 I.M.
