## STILL TRAVELLING

Georgina Lee's efforts in the British Trials earned her a place in the Team for the European Championships at Istanbul where she finished a creditable 11th in the 200 <u>FLY</u>. She has now just completed a 3 week training cam at the Gold Coast.

Melanie Easter, competing in the European Paralympic Championships at Braunschweig, Germany, won 5 Golds and set 3 European Records. She is now at Training Camp - guess where - the Gold Coast!

## ALSO

Trevor Clark travelled to Innsbruck for the European Masters Championships returning with 3 medals - 50 BK Gold, 100 FLY Silver, and 50 FLY Bronze. Craig Norrey, representing Geneva, took 2 Bronzes. Verity Green overcame her disability to collect several medals in an international Meet in Germany.

### COMPETITION RESULTS

### 3rd/4th July '99 Midland Age Group - Coventry

Gemma Hindson took Gold in the 100/200 FLY 1.05.82/2.24.78 and the 400 I.M. & Bronze in the 200 F/S. Lucy Lloyd-Roach also won Gold in her age-group 100/200 FLY and Silver in the 100 BK. Ian Potter won Silver in the 200 FLY and Jon Sheasby won the F/S, 57.44. Jon and Ewan Martin were 5th & 6th respectively in the 200 I.M.

### 9th/12th July '99

Our swimmers were competing on 4 fronts over the weekend.

- 1. In the National Championships at Sheffield, Georgina Lee gained Silver medals as the 2nd placed British swimmer in the 100/200 FLY and was 5th in the 50 FLY. Also swimming well on FLY, Lucy Lloyd-Roach and Gemma Hindson were 1st & 2nd reserves for the B final of the 200 m. Lyndsey Wyse and Nicola Sheasby joined Georgina and Gemma to win 2nd place in the 17/18 yr. Girls Relay Championship.
- We had 32 representatives at the Avon Neptunes Meet, losing out on the 'Top Club' Trophy by a mere 2 points. Good swims by the Paterson twins, Michael Bourne, James & Aaron Sumner, Ian Potter and Justine Clark.
- Yet another 34 club members competed in a relay gala at Lichfield, winning the Martin and Field Trophy on the final event. C/Hill 127, Etwall Eagles 125, Halesowen 119, Bedworth 99, Lichfield 86.
- 4. And OTHERS were having a good weekend at the Wolverhampton Masters Meet. Jon Baker had 2 wins in the 19/24 yr. Group, one of them over his ideal distance of 25 m. It was something of a benefit weekend for Hayden Wakeling who won all of his 7 events. Trevor Clark had 3 wins and Martin Temple a Bronze. New member Paul Millington celebrated by teaming up with Hayden, Kate Chase & Hayley Bettinson for bronzes in the Mixed Medley Relay.

## 2nd/6th August '99 National Age - Group, Coventry

We only had 3 qualifiers and they swam what were generally standard performances. Ewan Martin swam a sound 400 <u>I.M.</u>, 5.17.40. Jon Sheasby was 6th in the <u>FLY</u> and did well to finish 4th in the <u>F/S</u>, 57.39 after squeezing into the final in lane 8. Lucy Lloyd-Roach was unable to reproduce her best form and was 7th in 100/200 <u>FLY</u>.
