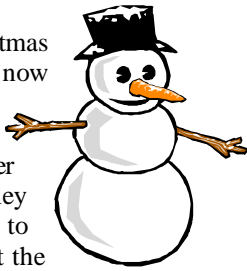




XMAS PARTY 2009
